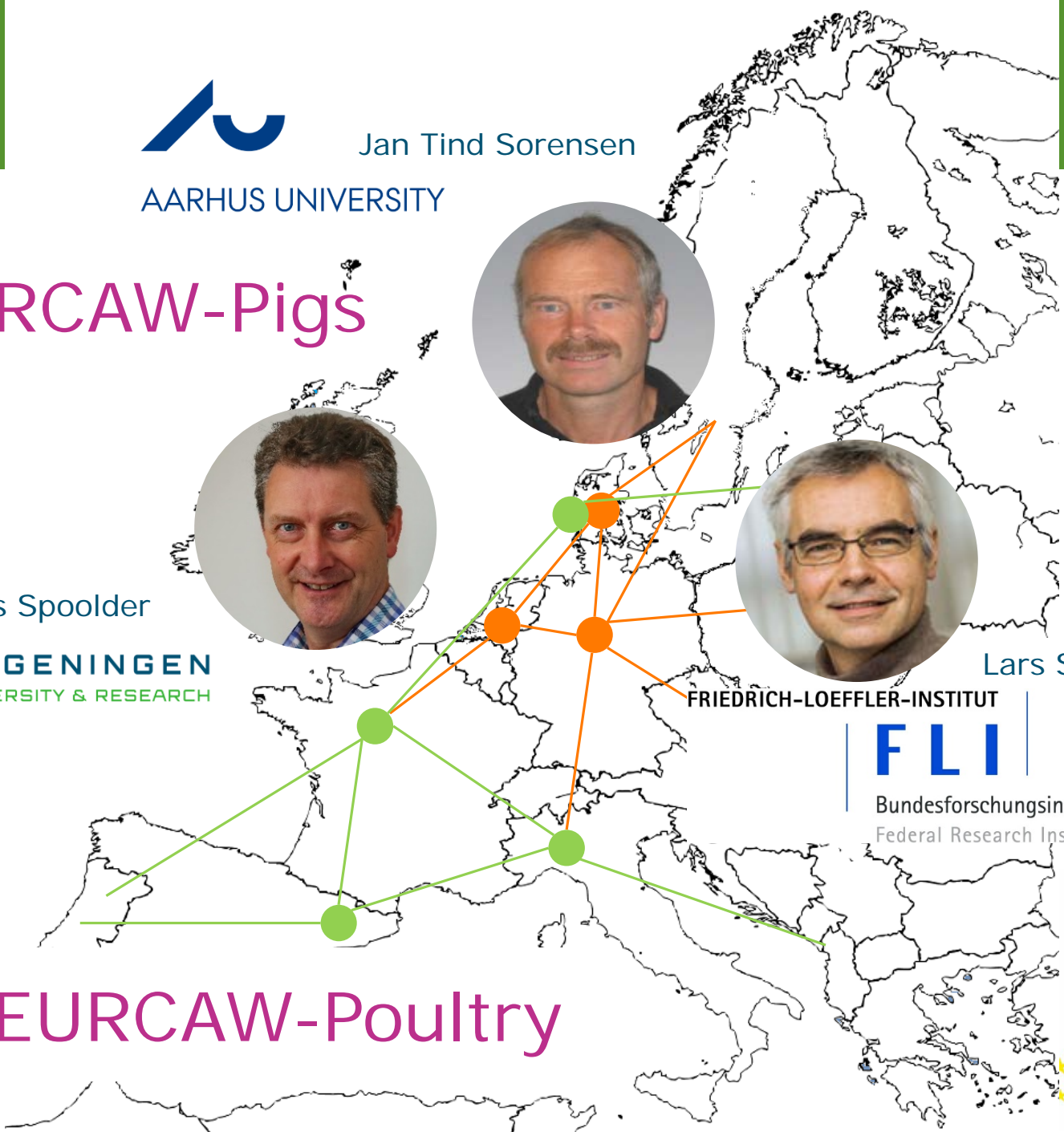

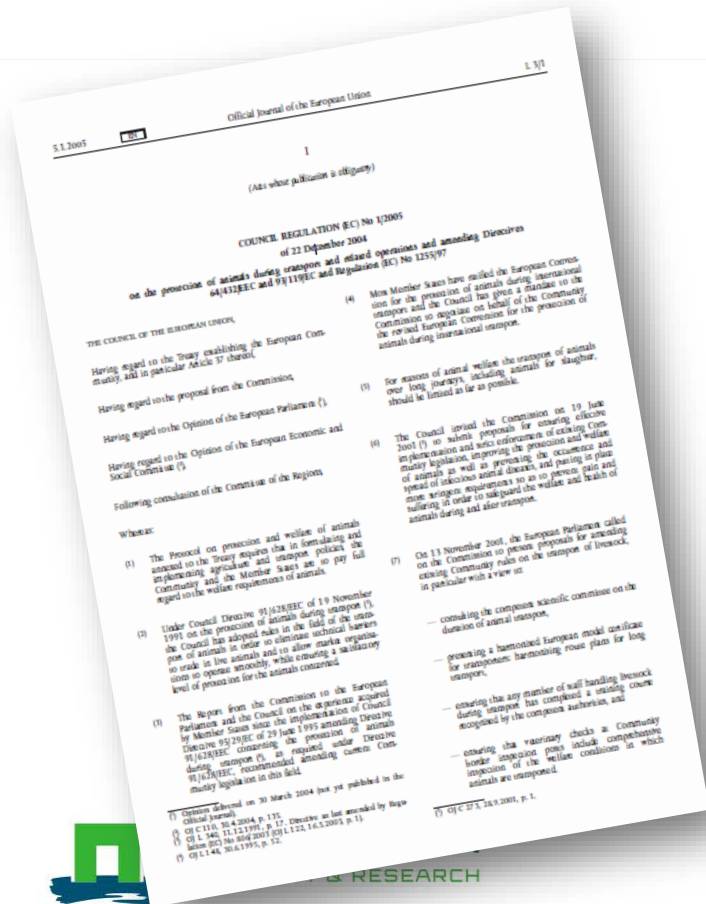

Main role: to provide technical information on



- On-farm pig welfare: Directives 98/58/EC and 2008/120/EC
- Animal transport: Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005
- Protection of animals at the time of killing: Council Regulation (EC) No 1099/2009

Main Target group

- Competent Authorities, Policy Workers and their 'support bodies': science, training, communication

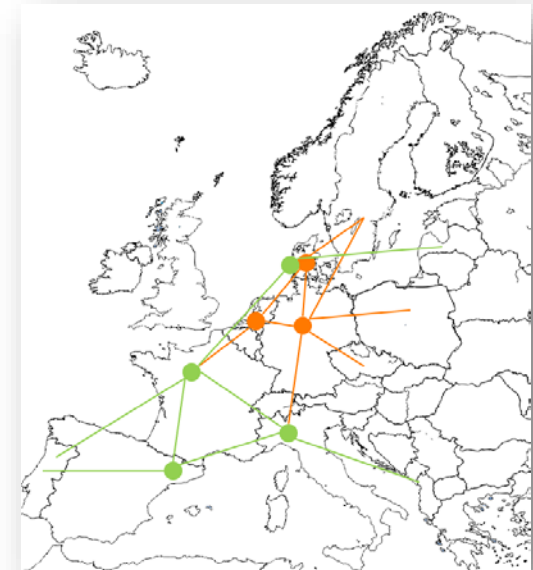
EURCAW Main Activities

Art 96 of 'The Official Controls Regulation':

1. COORDINATED ASSISTANCE
2. ANIMAL WELFARE INDICATORS
3. SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNICAL STUDIES
4. TRAINING COURSES
5. DISSEMINATING RESEARCH AND INNOVATIONS

1. Coordinated Assistance

- Central contact point for technical information requested by Competent Authorities (e.g. 'Questions to EURCAW')
- Networking across supporting bodies, CA's and policy workers
 - Existing networks
 - Regional meetings
 - National ref centres



2. Animal Welfare Indicators



- Compiling a list of relevant welfare indicators to verify compliance with legislation
 - 8 key areas of concern (e.g. stunning effectiveness, space on trucks, group housing of sows...)
 - Started with Tail biting

- The identification of 'Ice berg indicators'
 - Starting with 6 areas of the MS Action Plans (e.g. enrichment material, cleanliness, thermal comfort...)

3. Scientific and Technical Studies

- Existing knowledge of 8 key areas of concern, related to EU pig welfare legislation
 - Review papers and fact sheets: Transport and Farrowing environment are under way
- To identify demonstrator farms, transport companies or slaughter houses

4. Training & Education

- Describe and evaluate training activities and materials use.
 - Collaboration with BTSF
- Set standards for training activities, develop course types and materials.
 - Working with national reference centres
- To produce guidelines on how to change perceptions and attitudes

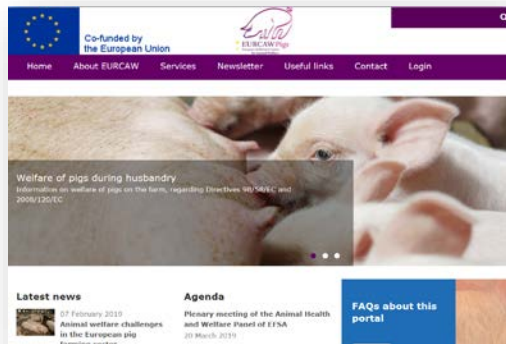
