- c) Minimum requirements for extended producer responsibility schemes
 - Presentation by the Commission of the organisation, content and timeframe for the preparatory work to develop guidelines on the modulation of fees and certain other minimum requirements for EPR schemes.
 - Initial exchange of views based on the following guiding questions:
 - Which elements of the minimum requirements for EPR schemes should be subject to Commission's guidelines to facilitate their implementation (e.g. audit requirements, enforcement of on-line sales, the principle of necessary costs, modulation of fees)?
 - Modulation of fees: which criteria for modulation (durability, reparability, re-usability and recyclability and the presence of hazardous substances) and waste streams (packaging (e.g. plastic packaging, beverage containers), WEEE, batteries) should be prioritised?
 - What past or on-going work/studies on modulation of fees are being done in Member States?
 - Link with the work on the review of the Essential requirements for packaging
- d) Other tasks, e.g. implementing act on a common methodology to report on reuse of products to be established by 31 March 2019, study on by-products and end-of-waste rules
