## WORKING GROUP The Commission explained how OCR Working Group members could get access to the 'OCR Communications' group on CIRCABC to data collected in TRACES on the implementation of the COI-CHED link. Three Member States informed that meetings were scheduled at national level to discuss the implementation of the COI-CHED link and that the Commission will be informed of the outcome thereof. One Member State referred to the need to ensure that operators fill in correctly box 10 of the COI. Furthermore, Commssion presented pending 9:30 -**Article 47:** Implementation of import implementation issues under discussion 1 10:00 controls on organic products with DG AGRI (CHED linked to several COIs; consignments composed of organic and non-organic batches; a new blocking rule preventing the completion of box 31 of the COI in case a COI is linked to a CHED and the CHED is not yet finalised). Finally, eight Member States requested to have the possibility in TRACES to update the COI in order to ensure an alignment with the decision recorded in the CHED. On this point, the Commission indicated that Member States will receive a reply following discussions between DG SANTE and DG AGRI.

3	11:00- 11:30	Articles 59, 62 and 63: Member State notifications in relation to border control posts	The Commission presented a new template 'Notification for a Border Control Post or inspection centre thereof' including in its part III a revised table 'Assessment against minimum requirements of information provided by competent authorities in relation to the designation of border control posts (BCPs)'. In addition, the Commission presented a simplified workflow for the handling of the notifications for a BCP. The Commission informed that the revised templates and workflow will be transmitted from DG SANTE to CVOs and COPHs shortly, also indicating the implementation date. Several Member States suggested an implementation date after mid-April 2023.
4	11:30- 12:20	New Common Health Entry Document ('CHED-N') – exchange of views on the way forward	The Commission presented the outline of the new CHED-N: regulatory work needed for the introduction of CHED-N and its interconnection with CERTEX and new release date (the exact legal construction will be presented to Member States at a later stage); intended scope of CHED-N; mandatory use of CHED-N and possible use of CHED-N for prior notification to local competent authorities.  The Member States generally agreed with the proposed actions. In particular, Member States welcomed the work for the interconnection with CERTEX. The Commission provided clarifications on the new date foreseen for the release of CHED-N. With one exception, Member States agreed that the plant health area is outside the intended scope of CHED-N
