The emerging disease Bsal was identified in 2013 and is present in several EU Member States in wild or kept populations of salamanders. Both veterinary and environmental authorities at EU or national level have been considering available scientific information and various measures as well as implemented some of the latter.

The Decision serves as a financing decision for emergency measures implemented by the beneficiaries or for actions directly implemented by the Commission to combat the eligible animal diseases and pests for the period from 1 January 2016 to 31 December 2017.

The draft Commission Implementing Decision on the adoption of a financing decision regarding a financial contribution by the Union to emergency measures to combat certain animal diseases and pests in 2016 and 2017 will be presented during the PAFF Committee on Plant Health on 27-28 June 2016 as a point for discussion. Hence, we kindly recommend to liaise with your respective colleagues in preparation for the vote.

B.04 Commission Regulation amending Regulation (EU) No 142/2011 implementing Regulation (EC) No 1069/2009 of the European Parliament and of the Council laying down health rules as regards animal by-products and derived products not intended for human consumption and implementing Council Directive 97/78/EC as regards certain samples and items exempt from veterinary checks at the border under that Directive. (MK)

This amendment provides with:

- new opportunity to use manure of farmed animals a fuel in combustion plants;
- new processing method for production of biofuel.

C.01 Exchange of views of the Committee on a draft Commission Implementing Decision amending Annex IV to Council Directive 2009/156/EC as regards methods for African horse sickness diagnosis. (EC/AEF)

The update of diagnostic methods for African horse sickness (AHS) by adding rRT-PCR and deleting competitive ELISA.

Based on the report prepared by AHS EURL (European Union Reference Laboratory), competitive ELISA is no longer used by NRLs (National Reference Laboratories) and is not available commercially, while rRT-PCR is commonly used by NRLs in PT (proficiency testing) and there is enough evidence that it can be used as a test for rapid detection of AHS.

This document is relevant for both, AHW and CIC, agendas. It amends several animal health and veterinary certificates and those amendments reflect recent amendments of Regulation (EC) No 999/2001. Those certificates are used by the Member States and non-EU countries during intra-EU trade in and imports from non-EU countries of certain live animals and products thereof:

- (i) to certify compliance with the relevant EU rules and
- (ii) to enable official controls to check compliance with those rules. As such they must be in line with the text of the relevant underlying rules, in this case those of Regulation (EC) No 999/2001.
