

Official controls



• Control plan:


- Risk factors identification / justification (data)
- Stratification: size, stage (hatcheries, pullets), farming system
- Quality Assurance Schemes not used yet
- Liaison between authorities/bodies (egg marketing, organics)
- Instructions and training for officials
- Implementation of controls:
 - Proportion of farms per year. Very variable.
 - Frequency of inspection per farm. Usually not pre-established.
 - Overstocking
- Randomly selected farms for validation of the control plan:
 - As a proportion of the planned controls
 - As regular projects




Beak trimming

- Variety of national rules
 - From total ban...
 - ... to generic and uncontrolled authorisation.
- Authorities' verification weaknesses
 - Trimming procedure
 - Use for preventing feather pecking
- Authorities' knowledge gaps
 - Records (at hatcheries, at farm, commercial documents)
 - Prevalence of feather pecking
- Potential of use for risk-based controls.
 - Farms with higher risk of feather pecking







- Limiting factor
- Verandas
- Temporal confinement
- End-of-lay hens
 - Forced moulting
 - Transport & slaughter
- Alternatives to culling male day-old-chicks
 - In-ovo sexing
 - Dual-purpose



11 MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION BY MEMBER STATES

The following points summarize opportunities for improvement identified by the Commission. They are presented here for consideration by the Member States.

- To better coordinate the controls between different authorities visiting hen establishments, in order to gain efficiency and to keep other relevant authorities informed about data, risk rating, frequency and result of the checks.
- To plan their controls using risks factors for which they have objective evidence of their impact on the welfare of the animal, and to take into consideration for that planning the results of previous controls including those performed by other reliable entities, such as quality assurance schemes.
- To consider the specific risks in farms keeping pullets and hatcheries, and to include them in their animal welfare checks.
- To train officials on how to establish the maximum stocking density in farms keeping laying hens by identifying the limiting factor, thus ensuring that these farms are not overstocked.
- As part of the verification of overall effectiveness of official controls, to use representative non-risk-based official controls at farm to be able to verify that the targeting is correct.
- To use IT systems to assess the results of the official controls and to use them to continuously improve the effectiveness of the official control system.
