- **Reporting format will be adopted as implementing act following the voting in the Waste Committee.**
- **Reporting format on food waste will be separate legal act.**
- **Deadline for adoption – 31.03.2019**
- **Reporting format will depend very much on agreed methodology – in particular the scope of monitoring**

## Annex II – quality check report

### As required by art 37.5

***5. The data reported by Member States in accordance with this Article shall be accompanied by a quality check report and a report on the measures taken pursuant to Article 11a(3) and (8), including detailed information about the average loss rates where applicable. That information shall be reported in the format for reporting established by the Commission in accordance with paragraph 7 of this Article.***

- **Quality check report shall enable comparison of reporting by Member States and improvement of quality over time**
- **3 parts**
  - General information
  - Questions concerning detailed analysis
  - Questions concerning estimations
- **Similar questions repeated for 5 stages** of food supply chain. **Additional questions for retail, food services and household waste** - due to uncertainties linked to share of food waste in the mixed waste

- **Subject to further work, including coordination with other quality check reports.**
- **Depending on the results of quality check reports further quality requirements may be added**
