Analysis of major deficiencies detected during the non-discriminatory inspections and an action plan to address them as provided for in Article 27 (2) of Regulation (EC) No 1/2005

1. ANALYSIS OF THE MAJOR DEFICIENCIES DETECTED DURING THE NON-DISCRIMINATORY INSPECTIONS:

In 2015, official inspectors of the State Food and Veterinary Service (SFVS) carried out 3889 checks to evaluate the conformity of animal transportation with requirements of Council Regulation (EC) 1/2005. The analysis of major infringements is given in the table below:

Penalties for the breach of requirements were imposed in 5 cases. 12 cases were reported as laid down in Article 26 of Regulation 1/2005. In other cases dates for correction of nonconformities were fixed.

2. ACTION PLAN TO ADDRESS THE DEFICIENCIES DESCRIBED UNDER POINT

The training for SFVS official veterinary inspectors who perform official control of animals during transport (general conditions for transport of animals, transport documents and checs of journey logs) where organized on 8 December 2015.

Cooperation with Competent Authorities in other Member States and notification of infringements as laid down in Article 26 of Regulation 1/2005 was carried out.
