

OCR Requirements are for Members States and for European control authorities



OCR

Official Controls Regulation N° 2017/625

on official controls and other official activities performed to ensure the application of food and feed law, rules on animal health and welfare, plant health and plant protection products

A single, harmonised, simplified and broadened legislative framework, <u>but</u>
OCR largely reiterates existing rules

Scope: 10 sectors: food, feed, animal health, animal welfare, GMOs, plant health, plant protections products animal byproducts, organic products, protected products/labels

Food Safety



Objectives of the OCR

- Inclusive approach: contribute to high level of food and feed safety, animal and plant health, and animal welfare
- Ensure smooth functioning of the internal market
- Continuation of safe and rule-based international trade;
- Contribute to fight against food fraud

State of Play

- The new Official Controls Regulation will replace existing rules as of 14 December
 2019
- Main delegated and implementing acts are being finalized to complement the Regulation
- Series of trainings organized for Member States to ensure proper implementation



Date of application of Reg 2018/848 repealing Reg 834/2007: 1st January 2021



Organics & OCR

- Scope of OCR (Art 1.2i): "This regulation lays down rules for organic production and labelling of organic products"
- Subject matter of Reg2018/848 (Art 1): « This Regulation establishes the principles of organic production and lays down the rules concerning organic production, related certification and the use of indications referring to organic production in labelling and advertising, as well as rules on controls additional to those laid down in Regulation (EU) 2017/625."

Rules on Official Controls set out in Regulation 2018/848 **apply in addition to** (and not instead of) the OCR.

The main objective is to present and discuss the new rules in Regulation (EU) 2017/625 on official controls along the agri-food chain and Regulation (EU) 2016/2031 on protective measures against pests of plants, which both become applicable on 14 December 2019.

The new legislation will also make enforcement more efficient by the introduction of a new computerised system (IMSOC), which integrates existing computerised systems, including the RASFF system which this year celebrates 40 years of existence.
