



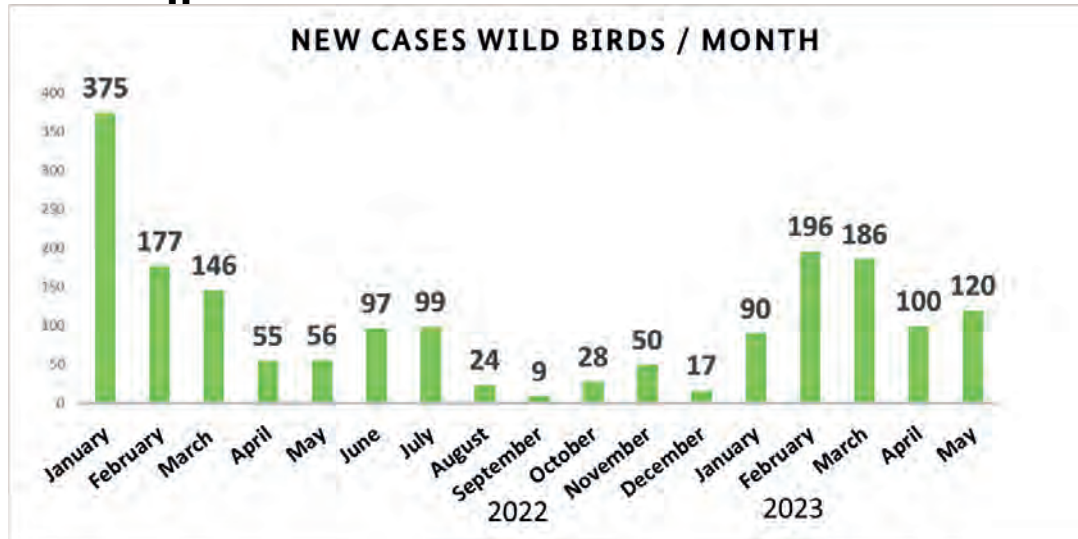

Evolution in wild birds

Increase of HPAI cases in wild birds
in May, mainly affected species:



Measurements for **mobile poultry trade** in Germany

Several detections of HPAI in wild birds in the **Land Baden-Württemberg**

The high risk affects the mobile poultry trade

Effective monitoring within the sale of live poultry **in the itinerant trade to avoid spreading** of HPAI infections, also in cross-regional traffic is therefore implemented

Delivery of birds is possible **only** as far as the birds at the longest **four days** before delivery are **clinically examined** or, in the case of **ducks and geese**, **virological** with a **negative** result for HPAI or LPAI.

A **certificate** about the **result** must be carried at the time of delivery

The arrangement of the examination, documentation and verification obligations is based on Article 257 paragraph 1 letter c) and Article 71 of Regulation (EU) 2016/429

The measure applies **from May 2nd, 2023**, up to and including **June 1, 2025**

Thus, the risk of a possible spread of the disease is effectively countered **without** having to **completely prohibit** this form of trade
