

### HPAI IN EUROPE IN BIRDS IN 2020 - 2023



# HPAI IN EU IN BIRDS / WEEK 2020-2023



High peaks in poultry in the past (red line) detached from peaks in wild birds (green line) In 2022 – 2023 epidemic: less outbreaks in poultry, but worrying trend in wild birds




# HPAI in wild birds 2020 - 2023

by week of suspicion in **wild birds** 



### Summary of HPAI epidemic seasons in figures




