









Things to consider

- * Controlling the population of wild animals that can transmit disease to domestic livestock and throughout the EU is crucial
- * Diseases do not know borders
- * Tackling ASF is a matter of both animal health and welfare for domestic pigs and wild boars
- * Farmers play a crucial role in preventing the entrance of the disease to the stables and are committed to further increase the levels of biosecurity.
- * Prevention is in the hands of everyone, not only the actors of the food chain (institutions, consumers, stakeholders, researchers, communicators...)
- * ASF is not transmissible to humans, however it can have a huge socioeconomic impact from farm to fork.
- *The pigmeat production should be not observed at the EU level only but seen in ana world context with Europe producing pork with the highest animal welfare standards and level of sustainability.
- * Applying adequate biosecurity measures in the farms and incentivising producers are two of the first and most effective ways to tackle any infectious disease, including ASF.
