








Evolution in wild birds

New Season from 15.7.2022 until 13.2.2023:			198 (114 lifted)





Evolution: Poultry and captive birds


Active outbreaks on 13.2.2023

Outbreaks 17 JAN-13 FEB 2023


In several establishments the lifting of measures takes long due to the period necessary for the final disinfection of manure.








Evolution: Poultry and captive birds






Infected establishments 15.7.2022 – 13.2.2023

- Number of cases in wild birds has increased significantly.
- Number of HPAI outbreaks in poultry and captive birds relative low.
- Biosecurity measures in place.
