## **Epidemiological situation**

- First outbreak confirmed on 04 July 2014 in a village on the southeastern border
- By the end of Sept BTV-4 confirmed in all 28 administrative districts



# Data on infected herds and animals for the period 04 July – 30 November

	Bovines	Goats	Sheep
Total number of herds	83 747	49 816	86 266
Total number of animals	632 553	383 755	1 558 222
Infected herds	808	391	6 016
Number of animals in the infected herds	26 036 (4,17%)	12 173 (3,17%)	533 733 (34,25%)
Fallen stock/Culled animals	410 (1,5%)	258 (2,11%)	27 040 (5,06%)



## Measures in place

- In accordance with Regulation1266/2007
- Movement restrictions
- Enforced surveillance
- Disinsection of animals, holdings, pastures, water reservoirs
- Compensations to owners for culled/dead animals
- Collection of culicoides in light traps to determine the end of the vector active season
- Vector-free period since 01 Dec 2014



# Measures under revised BT programme 2014

#### Following the CVET meeting:

- Serological survey in December in order to have clear picture on the sero-conversion rate and to allow to identify potential BT seronegative sentinel animals for sero-surveillance measures in 2015 and
- to identify the priorities for performing a vaccination campaign in 2015 subject to the quantitative availability of a vaccine

# Programme 2015

- Sero-surveillance programme using sentinel ruminants to detect a field virus circulation of BTV 4 or the possible incursion of another BTV serotype
- Clinical surveillance programme in the vaccinated herds and animals in order to control the vaccination or to detect the possible circulation of another BTV serotype
- Monitoring system of the vector with the view to entomological determination of the Cullicoides spp. present on the territory of Bulgaria and testing pools with PCR for virus presence
- Vaccination campaign of the whole domestic ruminant population with monovalent inactivated BTV serotype 4 vaccine
