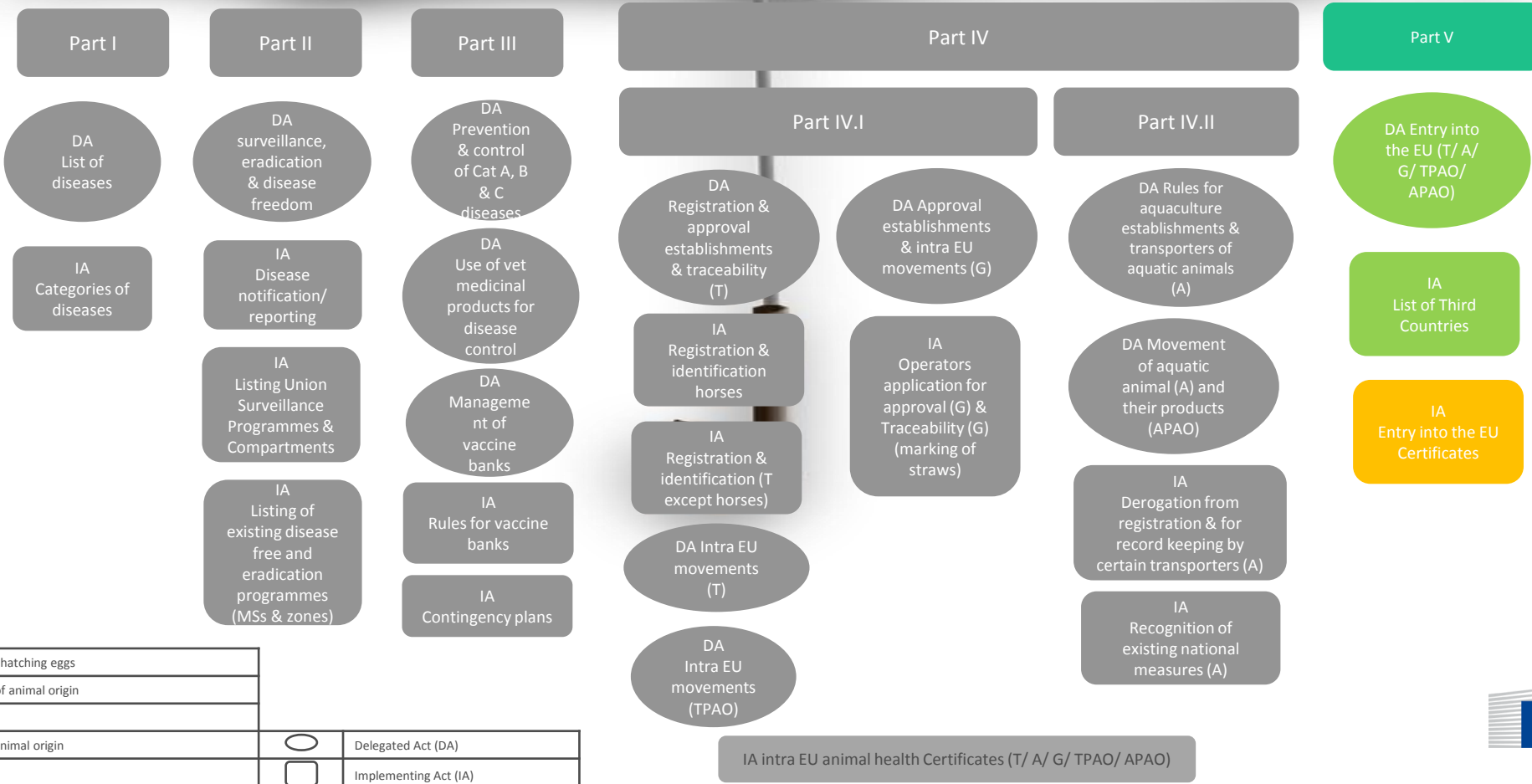

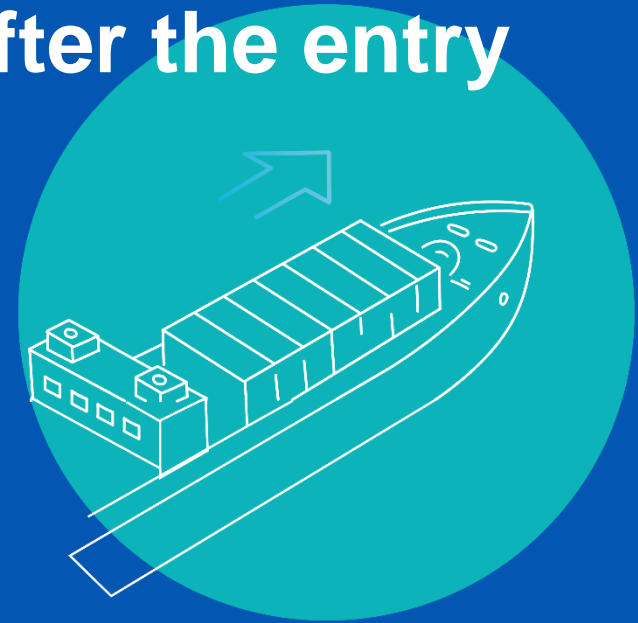

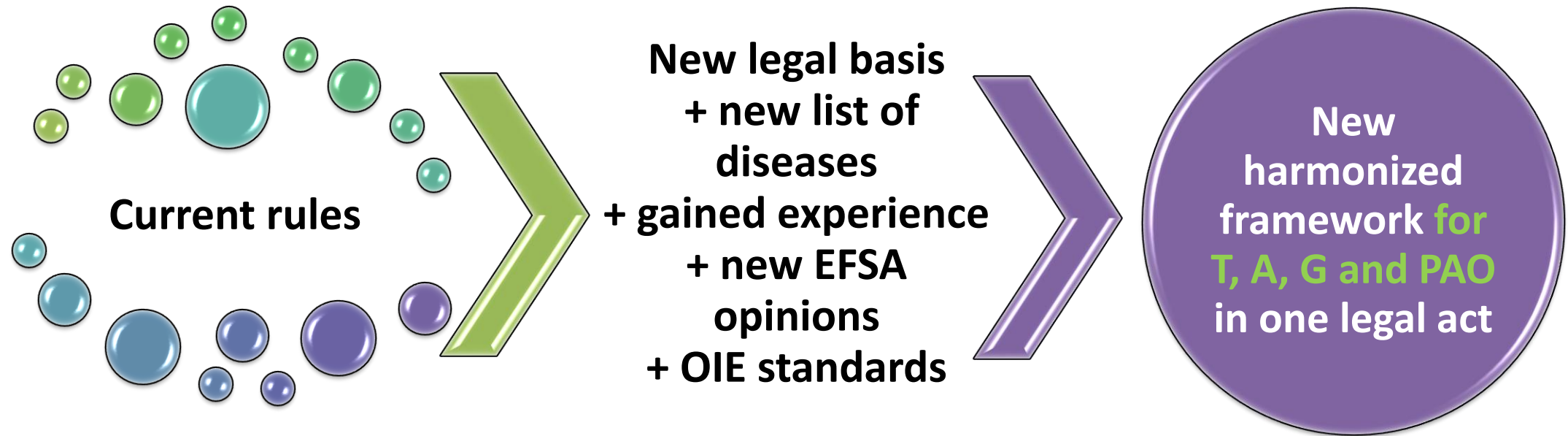
Basic rules for the entry into the Union in the AHL

- ✓ Articles 229 to 239 of Regulation (EU) 2016/429
 - ✓ **Listing** of TCs - criteria
 - ✓ Compliance with **animal health requirements** – at least as stringent as the requirements applied in the EU
 - ✓ Consignments accompanied by a **certificate**, or declaration where relevant
 - ✓ Possibilities for **derogations**

Definitions



- ✓ **Fresh meat:** includes minced meat and meat preparations
- ✓ **Carcass of an ungulate**
- ✓ **Offal**
- ✓ **Meat products:** includes treated stomachs, bladders, intestines, rendered animal fats and meat extracts

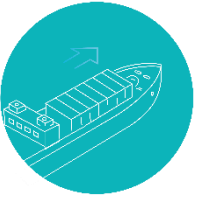

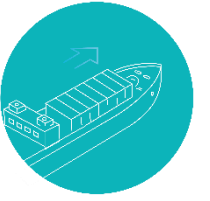
- ✓ Notification and reporting of **listed diseases** (relevant for the imported commodity) → Annex I
 - ✓ Live animals: all listed diseases (listed for the species)
 - ✓ Products: limited list of diseases depending on the product
- ✓ Systems to detect **emerging diseases**
- ✓ Systems to ensure that **swill feeding** is not a source of listed diseases

General requirements as regards the establishment of origin of the A, G and PAO



- ✓ Registration by the CA of the TC (unique registration number)
- ✓ Approved in the cases that is required in the Regulation (unique approval number)
- ✓ Under the control of the CA of the TC
- ✓ Record keeping requirements
- ✓ Regular animal health visits at frequencies proportionate to the risk

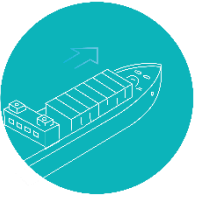

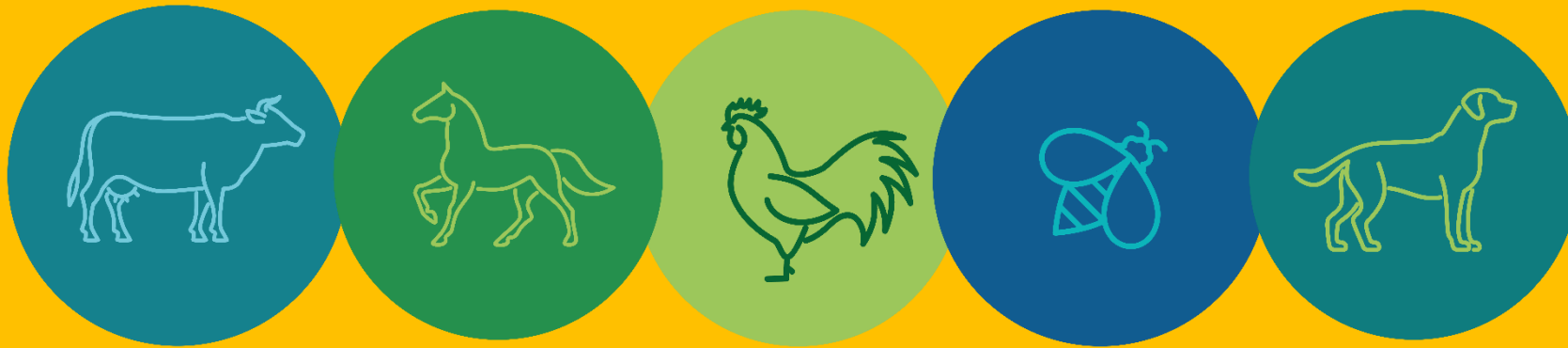

Disease freedom of the place of origin and specific conditions



- ✓ **Disease freedom** \neq disease-free status: the EU does not grant disease-free status to TC, therefore, where freedom from a disease is required to be listed, they have to demonstrate this freedom in accordance with:
 - ✓ the disease-specific rules laid down in that DA on surveillance and eradication programmes (category B and C diseases)
 - ✓ in accordance with a disease surveillance programme that must be assessed by the COM, following the general rules laid down in the DA on surveillance and eradication programmes (category A diseases)

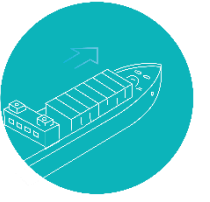

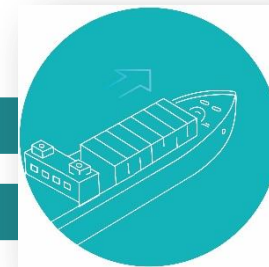


Principles

- ✓ An assessment carried out by the competent authority of the Member State of destination of the risks that the entry of those germinal products may present for the Union
- ✓ A third country, territory or zone listed and authorised for entry into the Union of the particular species and category of animals
- ✓ A confined establishment listed in accordance with Article 29 (entry of animals of specific species into the Union is authorised)
- ✓ The germinal products:
 - ✓ destined to a confined establishment in the Union, which is approved in accordance with Article 95 of Regulation (EU) 2016/429
 - ✓ transported directly to the confined establishment

- ✓ The treatment must be applied in the TC that is authorised for entry into the Union
- ✓ Reference to the Annexes laying down the lists of possible treatments for each commodity
- ✓ Requirements for handling until packaging

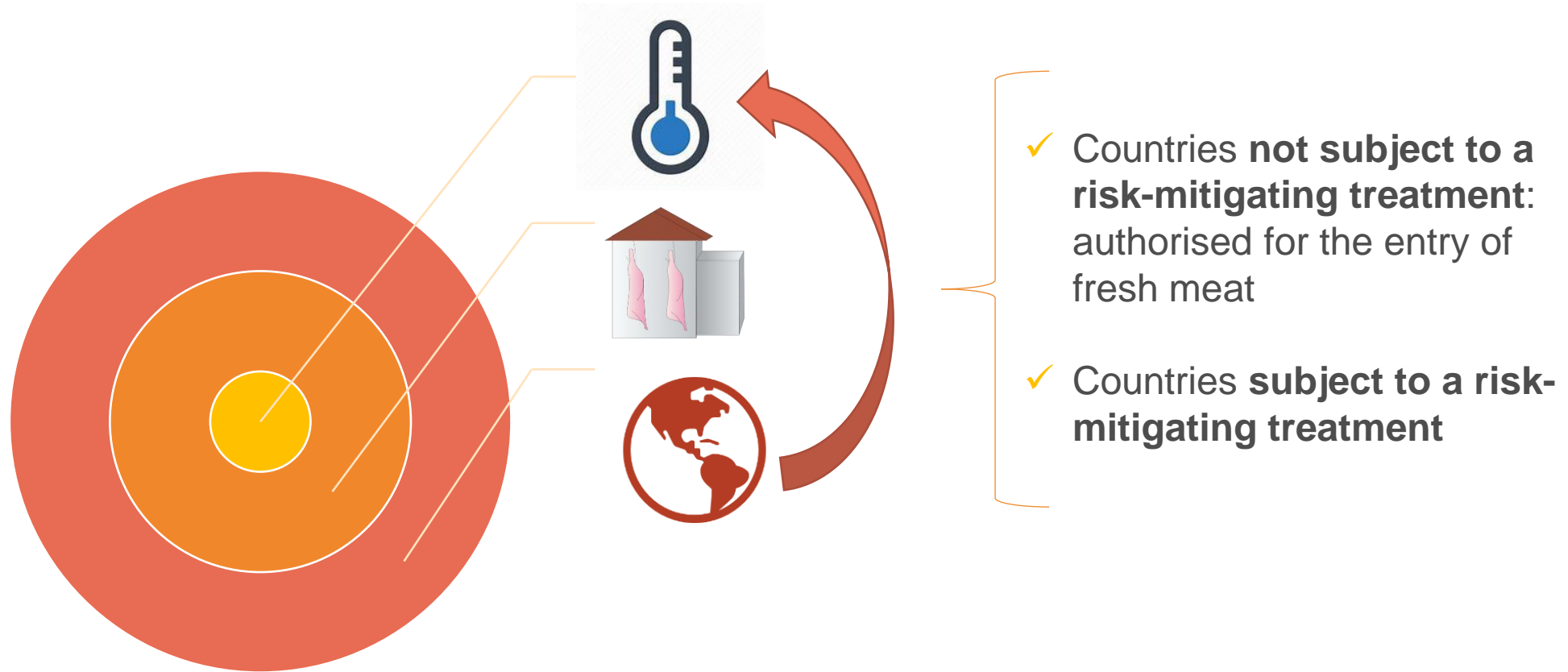

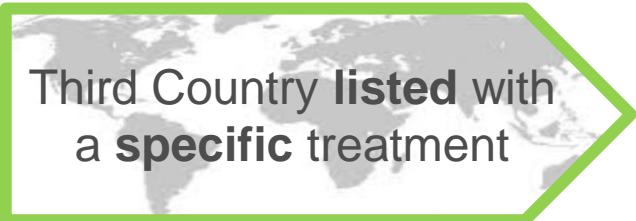
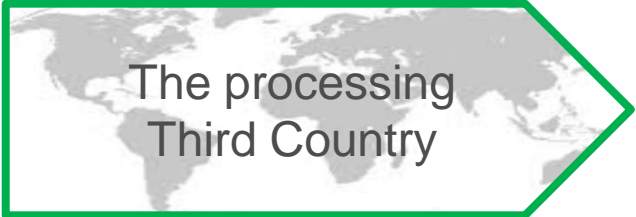

Casings



✓ NEW TREATMENTS (+ new definition ← OIE):

Bovine, ovine, caprine and kept porcine animals

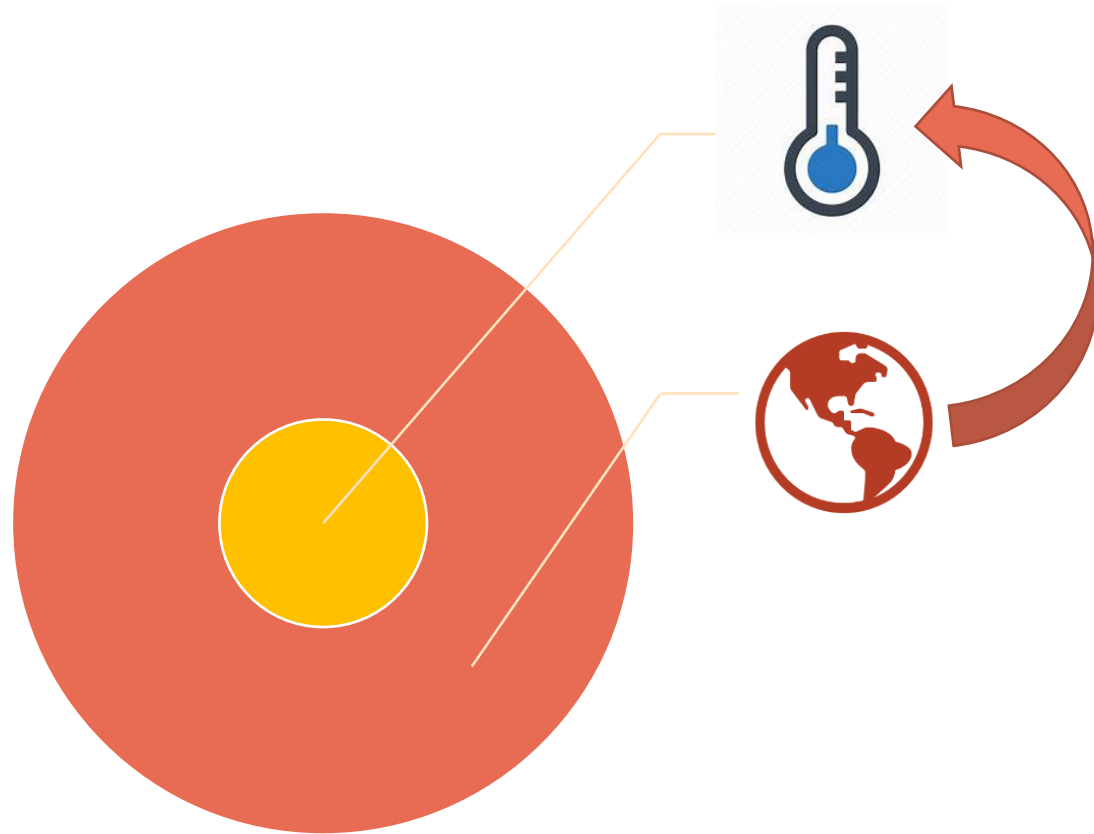
- Salting with sodium chloride (NaCl), either dry or as saturated brine ($a_w < 0.8$), for a continuous period of 30 days or longer at a temperature of **20°C or above**
- Salting with phosphate supplemented salt containing 86,5%NaCl, 10,7% Na_2HPO_4 and 2,8% Na_3PO_4 (weight/weight/weight) either dry or as saturated brine ($a_w < 0.8$), for a continuous period of 30 days or longer at a temperature of **20°C or above**

Other

- Salting with NaCl for 30 days
- Bleaching
- Drying after scraping

Products of animal origin contained in composite products



Accompanied by a certificate

CP containing meat products (any quantity)

CP containing colostrum-based products

CP containing dairy products or egg products which have NOT been treated to become shelf-stable (any quantity)

Accompanied by a declaration

Shelf stable CP containing gelatin and/or collagen (as only meat products)

Shelf stable composite products containing dairy products and /or eggs products subject to specific-risk mitigating treatments

Products of animal origin intended for personal use



- ✓ Derogation from animal health requirements and additional requirements for entry into the Union of infant milk, infant food and special foods intended for personal use (max. 2 kg)
- ✓ Derogation from animal health requirements for products of animal origin intended for personal use originating from certain third countries or territories → link to the lists of TCs
 - ✓ TCs with no maximum quantity (AD, CH, LI, SM)
 - ✓ TCs with a maximum quantity (10 kg) (FO, GL)

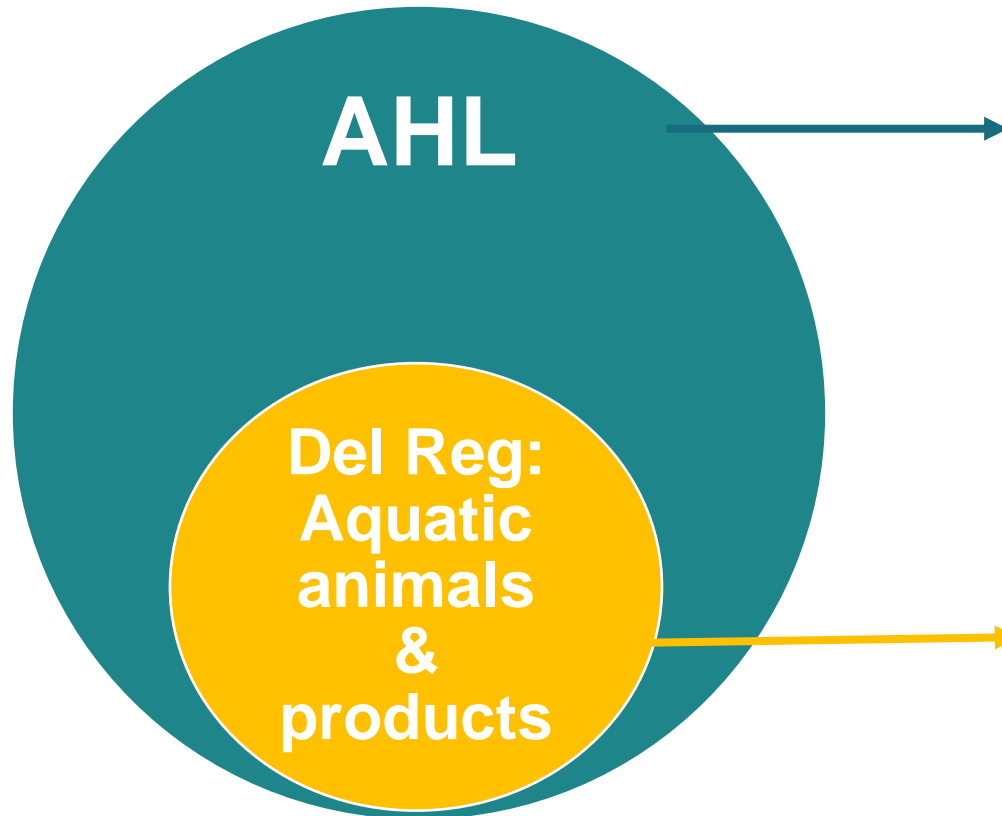

Part V Aquatic animals and products of animal origin from aquatic animals, other than live aquatic animals



Scope

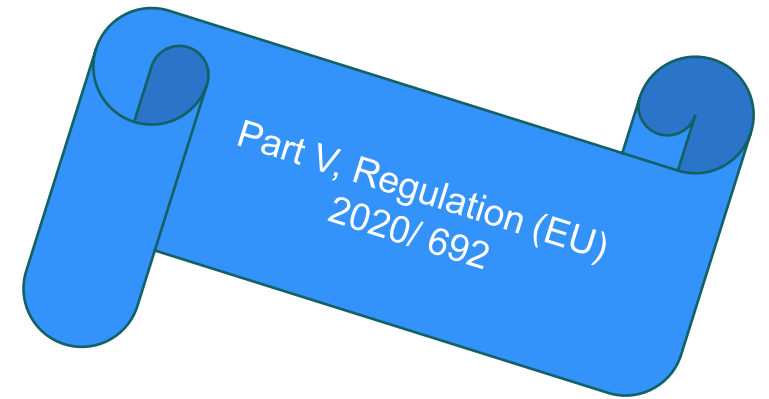


- **Fish** of species belonging to the superclass *Agnatha* and to the classes *Chondrichthyes*, *Sarcopterygii* and *Actinopterygii*;
- Aquatic **molluscs** of species belonging to the phylum *Mollusca*
- Aquatic **crustaceans** of species belonging to the subphylum *Crustacea*

- Aquatic animals and PAO intended for further processing in the Union of species referred to above which are listed in Regulation 2018/1882 for **Cat A, B and C diseases**
- Aquatic animals and PAO intended for further processing in the Union of species which are susceptible to the diseases for which MS have **national measures** under Article 226 of the AHL
- **Excluded:**
 - PAO other than live aquatic animals intended for direct human consumption
 - Wild aquatic animals and products of animal origin from those wild aquatic animals landed from fishing vessels for direct human consumption

Prior inspection, dispatch & labelling

Aquatic animals other than those which have been packaged and labelled ready for human consumption, must be inspected within 72 hours of loading

Dispatched directly to the Union

Not transported under conditions that jeopardise the health status

Water exchange only possible:

- at land based points approved by the CA of the country/ territory
- for well-boats: >10km away from aquaculture establishments

Consignments need legible label or entry in ships manifest

In both cases – link to the health certificate issued for the consignment

Aquatic animals: Requirements regarding TC/territory/zone/compartment/ establishment of origin

Must be free from Cat A, Cat B, relevant Cat C diseases and diseases for which receiving MS has national measures

Must be free from **Cat C diseases in all cases** where animals are to be released into the wild

All entries from other TCs/ territories/ zones/ compartments, must come from disease-free TCs/ territories/ zones/ compartments*

Vaccination has not been carried out*

Establishment of origin must be **registered / approved** in accordance with requirements at least as stringent as those set out in Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/691*

* Also apply with regard to diseases for which MSs have taken national measures under Article 226 AHL

Vector species

Annex XXX of DA sets out the conditions under which the vector species set out in Column 4 of Regulation (EU) 2018/1882, act as vectors of listed aquatic diseases

Rules set out for PAO from aquatic animals intended for further processing in the Union apply **only to susceptible species** (listed in column 3 of Regulation (EU) 2018/1882), **not to vector species** (listed in column 4)

Derogations for certain categories of aquatic animals

The requirement to originate from a disease- free TC/ territory/zone/compartment does not apply to:

(i)	Animals destined for a disease control aquatic food establishment
(ii)	Animals destined for a confined establishment for research purposes
(iii)	Wild aquatic animals coming from an approved quarantine establishment or destined for one in the Union
(iv)	Molluscs and crustaceans packaged and labelled for human consumption in accordance with Regulation (EC) No. 853/2004.

PAO from aquatic animals entering the Union for processing

Are not required to originate from a disease- free TC/ territory/zone/compartiment when they are:

Destined for a **disease control aquatic establishment**

Fish which have been **slaughtered and eviscerated** prior to dispatch

Handling after entry of aquatic animals and PAO intended for further processing

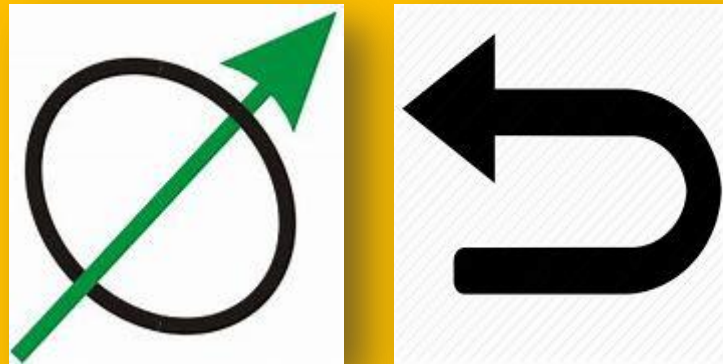
Aquatic animals must be **transported directly** to their destination

Handled appropriately to ensure that natural waters are not contaminated

May **not be released or immersed** in natural waters unless authorised by the CA

Transport water from consignments must also be handled appropriately

- ✓ **Ungulates intended for confined establishments** (no more references to other lists)
- ✓ **Bees** (no more references to other lists)
- ✓ **Dogs, cats and ferrets** (no more references to other lists)
- ✓ **Casings**
- ✓ **Products of animal origin intended for personal use** (TCs covered by derogation)
- ✓ **Transit:** compiles the specific conditions applicable to different kinds of transit that currently are in the relevant list



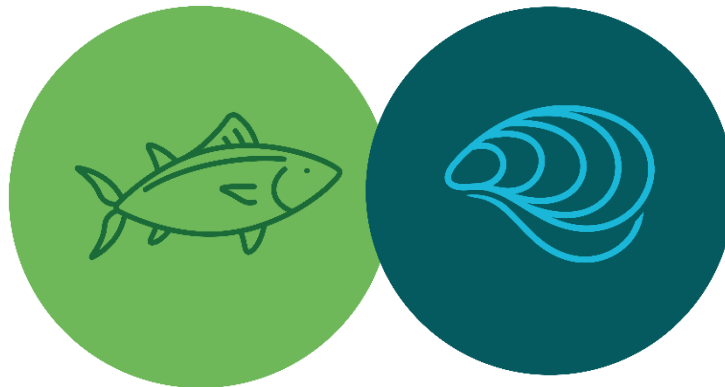
Main changes I

- ✓ **Poultry, hatching eggs, meat of poultry and game birds, and eggs** and egg products have been split into 3 lists
- ✓ The list of **milk and dairy products** has been split into two. One corresponds to column A-B and the other to column C of R 605/2010, (only the FMD situation is taken into account for AH). Pasteurisation requirements (PH) for the establishments of origin will be reflected in TRACES (at the level of country-zone)



Main changes II

- ✓ **Aquatic animals:** the list now covers only listed species as well as aquatic animals intended for aquaculture establishments, release into the wild and other specified purposes



General approach

- ✓ 1 Annex = 1 list = 1 commodity → 21 lists
- ✓ Each Annex = 4 parts
 - ✓ Part 1 = list of TC and zones
 - ✓ Part 2 = descriptions of zones
 - ✓ Part 3 = descriptions of specific conditions
 - ✓ Part 4 = description of animal health guarantees
- ✓ Annex I provides for general rules applicable to Annexes II to XXII
