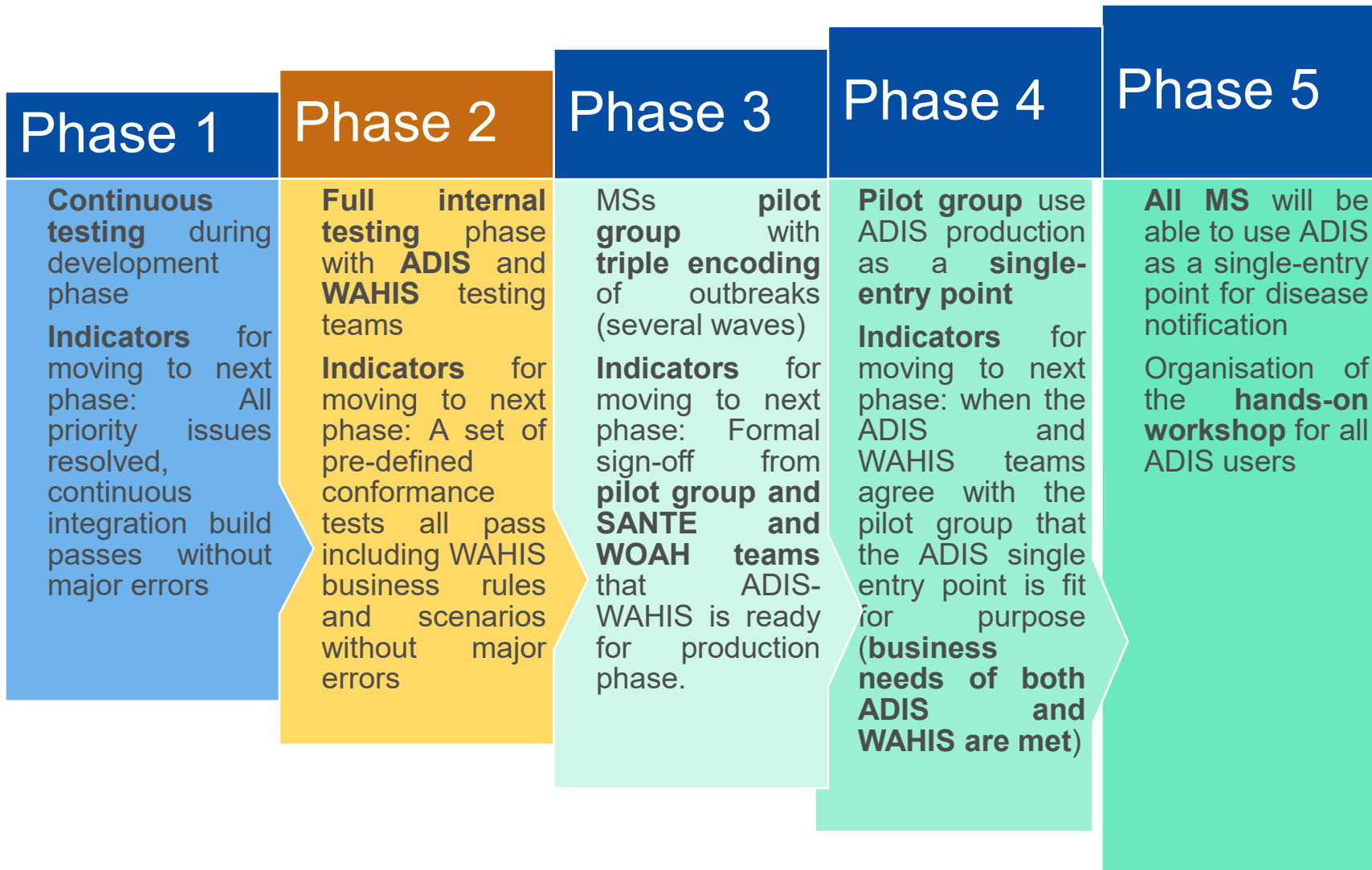

# Pilot phase 5: Migration to ADIS as single entry point

- It accommodates both EU and WOAHA notification requirements
- Learning curve
- Prioritised countries that expressed interest
- Waves of countries grouped to have a manageable workload

# Pilot phase 5: Timeline

- Every few weeks, new countries will be onboarded. During this roll-out, we will start with mainland countries, followed by the territories.
- From that moment onwards, the countries will be interconnected and will use ADIS as a single-entry point.

# New developments in ADIS (patches)

## From 1st January 2025

- Update of administration divisions for Greece and Sweden
- Changes related to the WOAHP referential data (new disease names...), EX:

Current name	New name
Q fever	Infection with <i>Coxiella burnetii</i> (Q fever)
Bovine viral diarrhoea	Infection with bovine pestiviruses' (Bovine viral diarrhoea)

## On 21 January 2025

- **Urgent issue resolved** on quantitative data of affected species when updating an outbreak from previous report – **Version 6.13.5**

# Next update – end January – version 6.13.6

**Notification to WAHIS only**

For diseases covered by points 3, 4 and 5 of Annex I of Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/2002, the notification to the European Commission is required in the cases foreseen by Article 3 of Regulation (EU) 2020/2002. While, for complete understanding of the notification provisions, reference needs to be made to Regulation (EU) 2020/2002 itself, diseases for points 3, 4 and 5 are copied here:

- Notification is required when the outbreak has been detected in the relevant targeted animal population in a disease-free Member State or zone for these diseases:
  - Infection with *Brucella abortus*, *B. melitensis*, *B. suis*
  - Infection with *Mycobacterium tuberculosis* complex (*M. bovis*, *M. caprae*, *M. tuberculosis*) (MTBC)
  - Infectious bovine rhinotracheitis/infectious pustular vulvovaginitis (IBR/IPV)
  - Bovine viral diarrhoea (BVD)

I confirm that the European Commission doesn't need to be notified and no email will be sent to the ADIS users. This outbreak will only be submitted to WOAHA as part of the current report/event.

- Regulation 2020/689: “For WAHIS-only”
  - On users’ request, enhancement of the user interface
- Improved visibility of the sufficiently stable diseases for each country (‘SMR only diseases’ table)
- Fix a data discrepancy (double counting) in HPAI NON-P weekly public notification

# Other updates foreseen

- ADIS shares the platform with TRACES
- Main current version is **6.13** (version **6.13.0** was released on 2/12/2024)
- Current patch version is **6.13.5** (released 21/1/2025)
  - "Patch" = limited but important changes / fixes without impact on structures / workflows
- During the forthcoming weeks / months, you may see more "patch" versions **6.13.N** being released. They may, but don't necessarily have to, contain changes for ADIS.
- **Longer term:** Migration of technical platform – version 8.0.0 - ongoing, but a long and cumbersome process – Q2?
