#### Notification within 24h for PRIMARY outbreaks of:

- Foot and mouth disease
- Infection with rinderpest virus
- Infection with Rift Valley fever virus
- Infection with lumpy skin disease virus
- · Contagious bovine pleuropneumonia
- · Contagious caprine pleuropneumonia
- Sheep pox and goat pox
- · Infection with peste des petits ruminants virus
- African horse sickness
- Infection with Burkholderia mallei (Glanders)
- Classical swine fever
- African swine fever
- Highly pathogenic avian influenza
- Infection with Newcastle disease virus (exceptions)

- Infection with rabies virus
- Infection with epizootic haemorrhagic disease virus
- Anthrax
- Surra (Trypanosoma evansi)
- · Ebola virus disease
- Equine infectious anaemia
- Dourine
- Venezuelan equine encephalomyelitis

#### Notification within 24h for PRIMARY outbreaks of:

- Epizootic haematopoietic necrosis
- Infection with Mikrocytos mackini
- Infection with Perkinsus marinus
- Infection with Taura syndrome virus
- Infection with yellow head disease virus



Notification within 24h for PRIMARY outbreaks *if* the primary outbreak has been detected in the relevant *targeted animal population* in a disease-free Member State or zone:

- Infection with Brucella abortus, B. melitensis, B. suis
- Infection with Mycobacterium tuberculosis complex (M. bovis, M. caprae, M. tuberculosis) (MTBC)
- Infectious bovine rhinotracheitis/infectious pustular vulvovaginitis (IBR/IPV)
- Bovine viral diarrhoea (BVD)
- Enzootic bovine leukosis (EBL)
- Infection with Aujeszky's disease virus (ADV)





Notification within 24h for PRIMARY outbreaks *if* the primary outbreak has been detected in a disease-free Member State, zone or, where relevant, compartment:

- Infection with bluetongue virus (serotypes 1-24)
- · Infestation with Varroa spp.
- Infestation with Echinococcus multilocularis

- · Viral haemorrhagic septicaemia
- Infectious haematopoietic necrosis
- Infection with HPR deleted infectious salmon anaemia virus
- Infection with Marteilia refringens
- Infection with Bonamia exitiosa
- Infection with Bonamia ostreae
- Infection with white spot syndrome virus ('infection with WSSV')





Notification on a weekly basis for SECONDARY outbreaks with a similar breakdown as for primary





The notifications shall contain the information specified in Annex II and be submitted electronically via the ADIS

#### INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED FOR UNION NOTIFICATION ON OUTBREAKS OF LISTED DISEASES IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 3(3)

- Date of dispatch.
- Time of dispatch.
- Name of the country.
- 4. Name of disease and type of pathogen, where appropriate.
- Serial number of outbreak.
- 6. Type of outbreak (primary/secondary outbreak).
- Reference number of outbreak linked to this outbreak (where applicable).
- 8. Region and geographical location of the outbreak.
- Date of suspicion.
- Date of confirmation.
- 11. Diagnostic methods used.
- Origin of disease.
- Control measures taken.
- 14. Animals involved in the outbreak:
  - (a) Terrestrial animals (by species) except honeybees and bumble bees:
    - (i) number of susceptible animals, including wild animals where applicable;
    - estimated number of clinically or <u>subclinically</u> infected or infested animals including wild animals, where applicable;
    - (iii) estimated number of animals that have died or, in the case of wild animals, that have been found dead:
    - (iv) number of animals killed;

#### ANNEX III

### INFORMATION TO BE PROVIDED FOR UNION REPORTING ON THE DETECTION OF LISTED DISEASES IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 4(2)

- Date of report.
- Reporting period.
- Name of the country.
- Name of disease and type of pathogen, where appropriate.
- Number of outbreaks by listed animal species or group of species during the reporting period.
- Date of confirmation of the last outbreak.

## Reporting results (article 6)

- By 15 March
- Content: article 11 Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/689

## Submission and substantial modifications of Union surveillance programmes (article 9)

- By 31 May (starting in 2021 for 2022 programmes)
- Content: article 11 Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/689





## **Approved eradication programmes**

### Annual reporting of results (article 7)

- By 30 April
- Content
  - Yearly: information laid down in Annex V (simplified set of data)
  - Every 6 years: information laid down in Annex VI (full set of data)

### Final results (article 8)

- 4 months after completion
- Content: information laid down in Annex VI covering:
  - The whole period of application of the programmes for Cat C diseases
  - The time frame between the last 6-annual report until completion
- For eradication programmes for category C diseases, there is no need to submit a final report if the programme failed



## Submission eradication programmes (article 10)

- By 31 May of the year preceding the year of their start of application (compulsory eradication programmes)
- At any time (optional eradication programmes)
- Content: Annex VII





# Recognition of disease freedom (article 11)

- Content: Annex VI
- Same information as for the report of the final results or the report to be submitted every 6 years if freedom is claimed after an eradication programme



# Exchange of information (article 12)

The list of territories, zones or compartments with disease-free status shall be compiled using the standard electronic template provided on the Commission's website.

MS shall amend that list within two working days
MS shall make the provisional declarations of
disease-free status for zones or compartments
(aquatic)not subject to Commission's approval the
standard electronic template provided on the
Commission's website
