Reminder of obligations

- **Article 185(3) Regulation (EU) 2016/429**
 - The CA must make certain information concerning **approved aquaculture establishments publicly available** by electronic means, subject to data protection requirements i.e. name, address and registration number, type of production, species kept, up-to-date information on the health status
- **Article 21(2) of Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/691**
 - **Additional up-to-date information concerning the health status** of the aquaculture establishment i.e. disease-free, in an eradication programme, in a voluntary surveillance programme, any other information that pertains to a Category, B,C or D disease

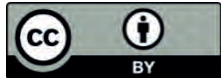
Logistics

- MS provides the Commission with a link to their public register of aquaculture establishments
- Commission places that link on [Aquaculture establishments - European Commission \(europa.eu\)](#) beside the flag of the relevant MS

Current situation

- Several MS have provided a link to their public register and comply with requirements of Article 185(3) AHL and Article 21(2) of Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/691
- Other MS have provided a link to their public register, but the information still reflects the requirements of Directive 2006/88/EC
- A number of MS have not provided a link to their public register
- Contacted relevant MS directly a number of times - all aware of obligations but websites were being updated, upgraded etc
