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State-of-play Revision

- Priorities are shifting onto the actual revision work
 - other work increasingly being minimised in favour of revising the FCM legislation
- Present Activities
 - Scoping paper being prepared internally → internal discussion → external elaboration
 - external elaboration being prepared → elaboration by groups of independent experts
 - sustainability study (2nd phase has started, long list of measures + market mapping)
- Foreseen timing
 - Scoping paper 2024, policy paper late 2025, IA mid 2026, legislative proposal early 2027
 - validation by new Commission first step

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State-of-Play Recycling

- Presently 56 Authorisation Decisions are in a far state of preparation
 - we are considering to present them in the next standing committee (20 September)
 - thereafter vote by written procedure
 - however, we may decide to first accumulate a larger batch
- There are some changes to the template, which we will explain in a note
 - to follow in the next few days
- Other matters to be considered 'after the first Batch'
 - Possible amendment to Regulation (EU) 2022/1616
 - BTSF course
 - Novel technologies
 - Several other matters, e.g. the register, enforcement issues, international trade, etc.

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AoB

- Regulation (EU) No 284/2004
 - Inconsistency between PAA limits with Regulation (EU) No 10/2011
 - Request for further (official) clarification of tableware vs kitchenware
- Handling poor sanitary conditions in the manufacture of FCM
- Lack of coverage of FCM in 2025 Com Audit program
 - particularly regarding official controls in third countries
- Recycled plastics in view of mass balancing approach under ENV legislation
