

Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/627 to be amended

Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/627

- Lays down uniform practical arrangements for the performance of official controls on products of animal origin intended for human consumption.
- Legal basis: Article 18(8) of the Official Controls Regulation.
- Planned to be amended as regards animal welfare, food chain information and health marking.



Draft amendments not (directly) related to animal welfare

- Prohibition to slaughter if food chain information has not been provided to the official veterinarian in case of slaughter on the farm (Article 40).
- Action in case of misleading food chain information of farmed game slaughtered on the farm and sent to a game-handling establishment (Article 42).
- Health marking:
 - in farmed game slaughtered on the farm and sent to a game-handling establishment (Article 48)
 - abbreviation of "European Union" in case of "European Community", with transitional period until end of 2028 (Annex II)





Animal welfare requirements today

Broilers:

- Identify abnormal levels of contact dermatitis [parasitism and systemic illness] (Annex III, point 2, of Directive 2007/43/EC).
- 18 Member States have (different) monitoring systems in place (2018).

Pigs:

- Ban on routine tail-docking + measures to prevent tail-biting (Annex I, point 8, of Directive 120/2008/EC).
- Very few Member States have a monitoring system in place.



Drivers – problems - consequences

Pigs: Lack of harmoniserd Animal welfare monitoring Tail biting and docking is not compromised prevented as requested by Directive 2008/120/EC Loss of income and **Broilers:** unfair competition for the farmers Foot pad lesions are not systematically identified as requested by Directive Uneven level 2007/43/EC or not identified in Lack of feedback playing field



Broilers – approach envisaged

- Inspection of the footpads (visual/automated and physical).
- Representative sample for a batch (50 + 50).
- Common scoring system (0-100 points).
- Communicated to the holding of provenance (Annex I).
- Threshold for alerting the competent authority.



Pigs – approach envisaged

- Inspection of each pig's tail.
- Common definition of "intact tail".
- Communicated to the holding of provenance (Annex I).
- Threshold for alerting the competent authority.
