1. Amendment to Regulation (EU) 2018/1882

Objectives:

- To review species set out in Regulation (EU) 2018/1882 to update and take account of new findings
- To ensure listing complies with Article 8 of Regulation (EU) 2016/429 => animal species which pose a considerable risk for the spread of specific listed diseases
- Where this is possible, to aim at the appropriate level of convergence with OIE Standards
- Retain, delete, add



1. Amendment to Regulation (EU) 2018/1882 (contined)

- Request made to EURLs for Fish, Crustaceans and Molluscs
- 3 separate reports furnished to EU Commission September 2020
- Internal review and consideration
- Working Group with MS to be held 29 March
- Will be available for public feedback
- Amendment to be drafted and presented at PAFF



2. Implementing Regulation on registration of aquaculture establishments and record keeping of operators

According to the AHL:

- Member States may exempt certain low risk aquaculture establishments from the requirement to be registered *identify those establishments*
- Member States may exempt certain aquaculture establishments from the requirement to keep records
 of all or some of the information listed in Article 186(1), points (c), (d) and (e) of the AHL identify those
 establishments
- Member States may exempt certain transporters from the requirement to keep records of all or some of the information listed in Article 188(1) of the AHL *identify those transporters*

Draft proposal to be discussed with Member States on 29 March

Will be available for public feedback
