# Framework to assess food waste prevention actions

#### **QUALITATIVE CRITERIA**

QUALITY OF THE ACTION DESIGN

Problem identification, definition of aim, objectives, KPIs, monitoring system

SUSTAINABILITY OVER TIME

Existence of a long term strategy to ensure the continuity of the action

TRANSFERABILITY
AND SCALABILITY

Action can be/has been transferred to a different context or upscaled

INTERSECTORIAL COOPERATION

Action relying on the cooperation between different sectors of society

#### **QUANTITATIVE CRITERIA**

**EFFECTIVENESS** 

Food waste was reduced in line with the target set

**EFFICIENCY** 

Ratio between results obtained and resources invested, considering:

- · Food waste prevented
- · Net economic benefits
- Net environmental savings
- · Social benefits
- Outreach




## Next steps

Additionally, FOLOU will also work to assure the appropriate **adoption of the project outcomes** by the key targeted stakeholders: primary producers, retailers, consumers, policy makers and researchers.



FOLOU main goal will be achieved by mainstreaming the adoption of innovative methods and solutions through a methodological approach based on **4 levers of change: understanding, measuring, training, adopting** 




The WASTELESS consortium is composed of 16 beneficiaries and 12 affiliated partners from 13 countries: Portugal, Spain, Belgium, Denmark, Italy, Slovenia, Estonia, Hungary, Austria, France, Greece, Czech Republic, Turkey and 1 associated partner from Switzerland.

#### **WASTELESS** will:

- (1) develop and test a mix of innovative tools and methodologies for Food Loss and Waste (FLW) measurement and monitoring, generating robust FLW data on critical and poorly understood Food Supply Chains,
- (2) recommend a **harmonised methodological Framework** for FLW quantification, and
- (3) develop a decision support systemic

  Toolbox targeting all food value chain
  stakeholders enabling the duplication of
  WASTELESS collection points across EU
  territories and different food
  commodities.

#### Methodology



#### **Outputs**

- ✓ Implementation of harmonisation of food waste measurement: **30 FSC actor**s (without households) quantifying and managing its FW through WASTELESS solutions; More than **100 households** using WASTELESS tools;...
- ✓ Well-informed and more effective policy and business strategies: **5 national FLW national policies will refer to WASTELESS** recommended framework; **5 Policy briefs** for experts and policy makers; **20% reduction** of waste within project case studies sites.

#### FOLOU and WASTELESS – Collaboration with the JRC
