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

No epidemiological data is available. Bluetongue is never detected in Latvia.

**3. Description of the submitted programme<sup>5</sup>:**

Programme has been developed with the target to vaccinate all susceptible population against any bluetongue serotype in 2009 in case of occurrence of the disease.

### *4.2. Organisation, supervision and role of all stakeholders<sup>6</sup> involved in the programme: The Food and Veterinary Service (FVS) of the Republic of Latvia is a state administrative institution headed by the CVO and supervised by the Ministry of Agriculture.*

*The FVS consists of the central body placed in Riga and territorial structural units (the local level)-27 regional offices. The central body coordinates activities of the local level and ensure a unified implementation and surveillance of legislation. The local level carries out the official surveillance in accordance with the state surveillance programmes and reports to the central body. The State authorised veterinarians report to the respective local veterinary office.*

*Vaccination will be supervised by Veterinary Surveillance Department of FVS (Central authority).*

**Monitoring outside restricted areas:** serological monitoring will be carried out in all territory of Latvia. Animals for serological testing will be chosen randomly. About 150 animals (all susceptible species) from different districts will be chosen for tests during vector active period (about method (about 1500).

**Monitoring in restricted areas:** will be carried out using sentinel animals. Bovine animals will be used as sentinel animals and will be tested to BT antibodies before putting in herds. During vector activity season each sentinel animal will be sampled once per month and tested to also be carried out in BT restricted zone (one trap in each district) during vector active season.

**4.4.6. Tests used and sampling schemes:** all suspected animals will be tested with BT antibodies using ELISA. Positive samples will be confirmed with PCR.

**4.4.5. Rules on the movement of animals:**

**4.4.4. Qualifications of animals and herds:**

To ensure common data registration system, Agricultural Data Centre (ADC) maintains central register of animals, herds and holdings. ADC is a state agency under the supervision of the Ministry of Agriculture.

Vaccinated bovine animals will be identified with the red stamp in bovine passport. Ovine and caprine animals will be marked with additional ear tag (possibly in red colour).

**4.4.3. Identification of animals and registration of holdings:** regulation of Cabinet of Ministers No 712, 16 December, 2003 "Order of registration of animals, herds and holdings and identification of animals" determines procedures of individual identification of each bovine, ovine and caprine. This regulation is harmonised with Council Directive 92/100/ECC and provides for individual identification of each bovine, ovine and caprine, of animals, herds and holdings and identification of animals" determines 90/427/ECC.

4.4.7. Vaccines used and vaccination schemes: as the highest risk for Latvia is BTV8, this programme is focused on vaccination against BTV8. In case of occurrence of disease caused by another BT serotype vaccination will be also carried out. Vaccine will be purchased by Food and Veterinary Service and distributed to territorial structural units of FVS. Vaccination will be provided by FVS authorized veterinarians. Inactivated vaccine will be used, in accordance with the producers instructions.
