Situation of SGP


SPAIN : No outbreaks since 17 May 2023

Last outbreak 17 May 2023

NO OUTBREAK EVER SINCE

All measures of CID (EU) 2022/2333 lifted as of 26 Sep 2023.

Sheep and Goat Pox in BULGARIA

1 outbreak - September 2023



Situation of SGP

BULGARIA: 1 outbreak in Gorno Yabalkovo village (Sredets municipality-Burgas region)

Outbreak 2023/1 (16/09/2023) Last previous occurrence of SGP: 2013, including 1 outbreak in Burgas (ADIS)

CID (EU) 2023/2067

adopted on 26/09/2023 PZ: 3 km radius (21d) – lifted on 10 Oct SZ: 10 km radius (30d) – lifted on 19 Oct

FRZ: high risk areas along the border (until 30 Nov 2023).

Outbreak located in area subject to enhanced surveillance (THRACE + TADs programmes)

Source of outbreak ? (Epi investigation ongoing)

Sheep and Goat Pox in GREECE

1 outbreak - October 2023



SGP in Greece

GREECE: 1 outbreak in Lesvos

Outbreak 2023/1 (24/10/2023) Last previous occurrence of SGP: 2018, 4 outbreaks in Lesvos (ADIS)

<u>CID (EU) 2023/2470</u> adopted on 31/10/2023 PZ: 3 km radius (21d) SZ: 10 km radius (30d)

FRZ: Lesvos regional unit (until 10 January 2024).

Outbreak located in area subject to enhanced surveillance (TADs programme)

Source of outbreak ? (Epi investigation ongoing)

CONTROL MEASURES

Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/687

□ Affected farms (outbreaks): stamping out, cleaning and disinfection etc.

Establishment of Protection Zone(s) (PZ) and Surveillance Zone(s) (SZ) around outbreak(s) (restricted zones)

□ In the restricted zones :

- Census of all farms and susceptible animals (species, categories, number of animals/establishment).
- Restriction on the movement and official control of animal and risk products movements, including reproductive materials and ABP.
- > Prohibition of **fairs**, **markets**, **exhibitions** and other concentrations of livestock.
- Enhanced biosecurity and passive surveillance.
- > At least one visit of all establishments keeping sheep/goats

CONTROL MEASURES

Safeguard measures: CID (EU) 2023/2067 (BG) and CID EU 2023/2470 (EL)

- □ Description of the Protection zone(s) (PZ) and the Surveillance zone(s) (SZ) around outbreaks.
- □ Description of the <u>Further restricted zone(s)</u>
- □ Additional measures in the Further restricted zone(s) (FRZ):

Movements of sheep and goats from the FRZ allowed only directly to a slaughterhouse located within the territory of the same MS for immediate slaughter.

- > Means of transport must :
 - comply with the requirements for the means of transport laid down in Article 24(1) of Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/687;
 - be cleaned and disinfected before any transport of animals;
 - be <u>cleaned and disinfected</u> in accordance with the requirements for the means of transport laid down in Article 24(2) of Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/687 under the control or supervision of the competent authority;
 - only include sheep and goats of the same health status kept in the same establishment;
 - be sealed by the competent authority at the establishment of origin after the loading of the animals and unsealed by the competent authority at the slaughterhouse of destination.
- The sheep and goats due for transport shall be subject to <u>a clinical inspection by the competent authority 24</u> <u>hours or less before the date of transport.</u>

PREVENTIVE MEASURES


EU-funded activities against emerging diseases of animals in high-risk areas

Regular, enhanced surveillance for the early detection of 4 diseases: [Foot and mouth disease (**FMD**), Lumpy Skin Disease (**LSD**), Peste des petits ruminants (**PPR**) and Sheep and Goat Pox (**SGP**)]

- Clinical surveillance for FMD and LSD in cattle
- Clinical surveillance for SGP in small ruminants
- Serological surveillance for FMD and PPR in small ruminants

Surveillance conducted by 2 programmes:

- The Transboundary High Risk Area Coordinated Epidemiosurveillance programme (T.H.R.A.C.E.), funded by the EU coordinated by the European Commission for the Control of Foot-and-Mouth Disease (EuFMD), in place since 2013 (Bulgaria, Greece, Turkey).
- A dedicated Surveillance Programme for Transboundary Animal Diseases (TADs), with direct EU financial support, in place since 2017 (Bulgaria, Greece).



Conclusions - Lessons learned

Emerging diseases like Sheep Pox and Goat pox can still return, even a very long time after their last occurrence !

All countries should be always prepared and vigilant for all emerging diseases, even if these were eradicated a long time ago !
