 - different levels of surveillance and/or disease control
 - For use of vaccination (or not),
 - For movement management (derogations!)
 - Regarding funding
- Need for a greater coordination between Member States
- Need for equal level playing field

Commission's role and input

- As regards vaccination (PAFFs October and November 2024), several MS were not supportive of a pragmatic approach concerning movements within the EU of vaccinated animals:
- Summary report of November's PAFF: Summary report Standing Committee on Plants, Animals, Food and Feed, Section Animal Health and Welfare 18-19 November 2024

The pragmatic approach related to that discussion was that if the competent authority at origin has grounds to ensure that the animals vaccinated against relevant BTV serotypes are within the immunity period guaranteed in the specifications of the vaccine the animal (that logically is longer than zero days) can be certified to move to another Member State. As not all Member States supported this, some Member States would like more discussions on this topic. The Commission took note of the comments, explained that this topic has also been discussed at CVO level in November and that it will be subject to further discussion at the Committee.
