HPAI in the Czech Republic

11 new HPAI outbreaks in poultry and 2 HPAI cases in wild birds since the last SCoPAFF meeting on 15–16 December 2022

11 HPAI H5N1 outbreaks in 8 regions: 9 backyards and 2 commercial holdings

- Vysočina Region (1 outbreak)
- Moravian-Silesian Region (2 outbreaks)
- Plzeň Region (1 outbreak)
- Ústí nad Labem Region (1 outbreak)
- Central Bohemian Region (2 outbreaks)
- Hradec Králové Region (2 outbreaks)
- Zlín Region (1 outbreak)
- South Bohemian Region (1 outbreak)

2 HPAI H5N1 positive wild birds in 2 regions:

- Central Bohemian Region (one greylag goose)
- Moravian-Silesian Region (one mallard)

COMMERCIAL HOLDINGS

Outbreak No. 2022/19, Plzeň Region


- commercial holding of laying hens with approx. 750 000 birds
- a slightly higher mortality of poultry (260 pcs.) without clinical sings
- Al H5N1 confirmed on 30 December 2022, HPAI on 31 December 2022.
- restricted zone established on 2 January 2023
- culling of all remaining birds, disposal of carcasses and poultry products has started on 3 January 2023 and still ongoing

outbreak

protection zone (3 km) surveillance zone (10 km)

no animals have been moved from the outbreak to other Member States or Non-EU countries in the relevant 21 days before the confirmation of the outbreak

COMMERCIAL HOLDINGS


Outbreak No. 2023/2, Central Bohemian Region

- commercial holding of fattening turkeys and broilers (Gallus Gallus) with approx. 13 000 birds (approx. 1000 turkeys and 12 000 broilers)
- a higher mortality of turkeys, without clinical sings
- Al H5N1 confirmed on 2 January 2023, HPAI on 3 January 2023
- restricted zone established on 3 January 2023
- culling of all remaining birds in the affected holding, disposal of carcasses and preliminary cleaning and disinfection were performed on 4 January 2023

outbreak

protection zone (3 km) surveillance zone (10 km)

no animals have been moved from the outbreak to other Member States or Non-EU countries in the relevant 21 days before the confirmation of the outbreak

BACKYARDS

9 outbreaks HPAI H5N1:

- No. 2022/17 16 December 2022, Vysočina Region, 24 birds (laying hens, ducks)
- No. 2022/18 29 December 2022, Moravian-Silesian Region, 10 laying hens
- No. 2022/20 4 January 2023, Moravian-Silesian Region, 21 laying hens
- No. 2023/1 3 January 2023, Ústí nad Labem Region, 12 laying hens
- No. 2023/3 4 January 2023, Hradec Králové Region, 27 laying hens
- No. 2023/4 6 January 2023, Zlín Region, 7 laying hens
- No. 2023/5 5 January 2023, South Bohemian Region, 32 birds (laying hens, geese, ducks, turkeys)
- No. 2023/6 9 January 2023, Central Bohemian Region, 6 laying hens
- No. 2023/7 13 January 2023, Hradec Králové Region, 29 laying hens
- poultry and poultry products for private use only
- a higher mortality of birds, clinical sings
- culling of all remaining birds in the affected holdings, disposal of carcasses and poultry products, preliminary cleaning and disinfection
- restricted zones established around all outbreaks
