

Structure of Regulation 2017/625 (OCR)

General Principles Articles 1 - 15

Subject matter, scope & definitions, Competent Authorities general requirements

Common Provisions - Articles 142 - 167



Planning, performing, reporting

Multiannual control plans, coordinated by a single body; publicly available; reviews/updates

Risk based, regular controls at an appropriate frequency, performed without prior notice, unless necessary and duly justified for the controls to be carried out

Annual reports by 31 August each year; including the outcome of official controls





The risk based approach

Controls to be performed "regularly, on a risk basis and with appropriate frequency"

Own controls, including private quality schemes

Risks associated with animals and goods, activities, location...and the likelihood that consumers might be misled

Operator's **past** record



Scope:

- Animal
- Food
- Feed
- Plant



Entry into the Union – Main rules

"High risk"

"Low risk"

Animals, products of animal origin, germinal products, animal by-products, plant, plant products and certain feed and food of non-animal origin* =

Designated **BCP** of first arrival

Always documentary checks; risk based identity and physical checks

Animals and goods whose inherent risks do not require systematic border controls =

An **appropriate place** within the customs territory of the Union

Regular, risk based controls with appropriate frequency (established by Member States)

Same set of measures in cases of non-compliance, including enforcement measures

* Positive lists identifying animals and goods with CN codes are established





Fraudulent or deceptive practices

Likelihood of consumers being misled

Whistle-blowers

Authenticity and integrity of the agri-food chain

Reference centres

Financial penalties to reflect advantage or turnover

Exchange of information (IMSOC, AAC etc.)



Additional or special rules on official controls

- The rule on risk-based controls applies as a general rule
- Additional more specific rules on official controls may be established **in addition** to the rules in the OCR: eg rules in Art. 18 to 27 OCR; rules on controls in Organic Regulation (EU) 2018/848
- Art. 9(3) OCR official controls performed prior to the placing on the market for issuance of official certificates/attestations required by sectoral rules in art. 1(2) as a condition for placing on the market must be performed in accordance with the sector specific rules
