Subject-matter and Scope

- Listed diseases of terrestrial and aquatic animals
- Rules for the surveillance of all Cat. E diseases
 - Notification, case definition, design of surveillance
 - Union surveillance programme
- Rules for eradication programme
 - Compulsory for Cat. B diseases
 - Optional for Cat. C diseases
- Rules for disease free status of MS or zones:
 - Criteria for granting,
 - Criteria for maintenance and rules for suspension
 - Derogation of approval of status by the Commission
- Compartments for aquatic diseases
- Transitional rules



Surveillance

- CAs have flexibility to design and organise surveillance systems that comply with:
 - Objectives by disease categories / rules for derogations
 - General principles on design
 - Requirements for Union surveillance programme
- Passive surveillance based on
 - Notification of suspicions to CA → investigations
 - Notification of abnormalities to vet [CA] → investigations
- Suspect and confirmed case definitions
- Rules for diagnostic methods and laboratory tests
 - List of approved methods/tests in Annex
 - Technical procedures published by URL or based on OIE



Eradication programmes

- General provisions
 - Scope of animal population: those to grant disease free status + additional animal population if needed
 - Scope of territory: MS or zone (requirements), possible coordination of activities at borders
 - Targets and period of application / duration 6 years
- Disease control strategies (terrestrial animals)
 - Disease free establishment (Bru, TB, IBR, EBL, AD, BVD): Classification of status, disease control measures
 - 'Territory based' approach (rabies, BTV, [...]): safe movements, treatment/vaccination, disease control measures

Disease free status

- Criteria for granting disease free status according to the different possibilities laid down in the AHL
- Disease free status based on combinations of
 - pre-requisite on surveillance, disease control measures, registration, traceability, movement
 - disease specific criteria based on sanitary situation +/vaccination status: alignment with OIE considered on a
 case by case basis
- Maintenance: surveillance and provisions for maintenance [suspension] in case of outbreaks
- Transitional rules: smooth recognition for status already granted and approved eradication programme
