1. ANALYSIS OF THE MAJOR DEFICIENCIES DETECTED DURING THE NON-DISCRIMINATORY INSPECTIONS

For the purpose of this annual report, the following have been considered to be major deficiencies:

- 1.1. Non-realistic journey plans for long distance journeys waiting times on borders to third countries- time to final destination;
- 1.2. Not sufficient condition of some animals (not fit for transport-pregnant animals);
- 1.3. Absence of original Certificate of Competence on board of vehicle;
- 1.4 Falsed approval document.

2. ACTION PLAN TO ADDRESS THE DEFICIENCIES DESCRIBED UNDER POINT 1.

- 2.1. On meetings with local level officials is pointed out, that allways they must control journey plans before loading of animals with relevant websites (Google maps, Via Michelin), given to officials contacts with Bulgaria Turkey border vet services, also given information about European Court desisions that force to meet requirements of Regulation 1/2005 to the final destination in 3-rd countries.
- 2.2. Information about how to assess animals fitness for transport was sended to local officials. They are instructed to assess animals condition before loading.
- 2.3. Local level officials are instructed to pay more attention on documents presented by transporters.
