Plant Health Regulation Formats of plant passports (IA)

- Stakeholder feedback in October 2017
- Voted in PAFF 15 November 2017
- Adoption of IA by the Commission by 14 December 2017
- Date of application: 14 December 2019

Legend: IA (Implementing Act), DA (Delegated Act)



Plant Health Regulation Plant passports – other provisions (IA+DA)

- IA = Art.81(1.b)/final users in PZs; 83(3)/traceability code exemptions
- DA= Art.81(2)/final users-small quantities; 87(4)/detailed measures for frequency & timing of examinations; 89(2)/criteria to be fulfilled by professional operators

- Adoption of joint IA for both lists by the Commission (by 14 December 2018)

Plant Health Regulation Priority pests (DA)

- JRC and EFSA support (June 2017 July 2019);
 - Development of a methodology to identify the priority pests;
 - Implementation of the methodology taking into account available data (e.g. MS inputs);
- Expert Group support (first half 2018 first half 2019);
- Stakeholder feedback (second half 2019);
- Commission's adoption of the Delegated Act (second half 2019);
- Entry into force, following 2-months period of Council and EP right of objection (second half 2019 - early 2020);

N.B. No vote of the Standing Committee required



Official controls – Internal movements (Art. 22 - IA)

Under article 22(3) the Commission is empowered to lay down rules on uniform official controls on plants (for internal movement)

- Draft text to be discussed at PAFF Committee (1st quarter 2018)
- Internal Commission procedures (2nd quarter 2018)
- Stakeholder feedback (2nd quarter 2018)
- Discussion and vote at PAFF Committee (4th quarter 2018)

The empowerment of Paragraph 2 would not be used because import rules will be defined and covered by article 54 with the aim of having a horizontal approach of controls among different sectors.



Official controls - Regulation 2017/625 Horizontal empowerments where Plant Health aspects will be included

IMPLEMENTING ACTS

- Art.54.3 frequency of checks
- Art.58 CHED

DELEGATED ACTS

- Art.51 points 1 and 2 official controls at border control posts
- Art.53.1 official controls not performed at border control posts
- Art.77.1 specific measures for official controls (wood packaging material)



Amendment of the Annexes of Council Directive 2000/29/EC (I)

The provisions of Commission Implementing Directive (EU) 2017/1279 will apply from 1 January 2018.

The European Commission has informed and clarified via WTO - SPS which data need to be provided prior to the start of trade by the non-FU countries:

- For Cercospora angolensis, Phyllosticta citricarpa (CBS), Xanthomonas citri pv. citri and Xanthomonas citri pv. aurantifolii (citrus canker)
 - a) Country freedom or
 - b) Areas free from the harmful organism.
- For Xanthomonas citri pv. citri and Xanthomonas citri pv. aurantifolii (citrus canker) and Thaumatotibia leucotreta:
 - a) Treatment of the fruits.



Amendment of the Annexes of Council Directive 2000/29/EC (II)

Commodities for which info is required:

- a) Fruits of Citrus, Fortunella Swingle, Poncirus Raf., Microcitrus Swingle, Naringi Adans., Swinglea Merr., and their hybrids originating in all non-EU countries;
- b) Fruits of *Capsicum, Prunus persica,* and *Punica granatum* originating in countries of the African continent, Cape Verde, Saint Helena, Madagascar, La Réunion, Mauritius and Israel;
- c) Plants of *Microcitrus* Swingle, *Naringi* Adans., and *Swinglea* Merr., other than fruits and seeds, originating in all non-EU countries.

Tomato fruit is regulated (phytosanitary certificate + additional declaration).



Xylella fastidiosa Latest revision of Decision (EU) 2015/789 (I)

Endorsed by PAFF on 19 October 2017; COM adoption expected soon.

MAIN POINTS

- Corsica and Baleares declared as containment areas;
- Harmonised diagnostic tests within and outside the demarcated areas;
- Specific measures in case of isolated cases;
- Reduced buffer zone for outbreaks under eradication;
- Revised survey grids applied in the buffer zones;



Xylella fastidiosa Latest revision of Decision (EU) 2015/789 (II)

- MS to authorise **planting of host plants**, and preferably those varieties less susceptible to *Xf*, in some parts of the containment areas (Corsica, Apulia, Baleares);
- **Felling exemptions** for monumental non-infected trees located in the clear cut area (100 m) subject to physical isolation;
- De-listing of grapevine varieties resistant to the Apulian strain;
- Stricter requirement for movement in the EU of **plant species**, which have been regularly found infected, such as *Coffea*, Landula dentata, Nerium oleander, Olea europea, Polygala myrtifolia, Prunus dulcis, when grown in areas of the EU or non-EU territory free from Xf.



Plant Health & Awareness Raising

- Lack of awareness on plant health risks within the society ⇒ limited understanding for eradications
- Proposal Maltese Presidency for action
- A Commission Working Group on Awareness Raising for Plant Health will start early 2018:
