Birds kept on the holding were culled and cleaning and disinfection was carried out.
WED 09/03	Israel	Israel HPAI H5N1 confirmed in poultry	Fax 002 to Ms CVO's: Israel reported an outbreak of highly pathogenic avian influenza of the H5N1 subtype in a poultry holding located in the village of Rosh Zurim, district of Beit-Lehem, province Jehuda and Samaria. The turkeys present on the infected holding were culled and two more turkey flocks in the same settlement will also be killed. Protection and surveillance zones were established and disease surveillance has been increased throughout the country. The Israeli veterinary authorities informed the Commission that certification for exports of live poultry and ratites, their day-old chicks and hatching eggs and of meat of poultry, farmed and wild game birds was immediately suspended.

MON 04/04		Meeting of the SCoFCAH ³	 Draft working document (Doc. SANCO/7126/2010-Rev.3) on animal health conditions for birds participating in EU bird exhibitions was discussed. EFSA (Panel on Animal Health and Welfare) gave a presentation on the potential implications for animal health of the pandemic (H1N1) 2009 influenza and on monitoring for the emergence of possible new pandemic strains of influenza in animals. The Netherlands gave a presentation on an outbreak of low pathogenic avian influenza The Commission informed about highly pathogenic avian influenza of the H5N1 subtype in Israel (Doc. SANCO/7042/2011). Draft Commission Implementing Regulation amending Annex I to Regulation (EC) No 798/2008 as regards the entry for Israel in the list of third countries, territories, zones or compartments (Doc. SANCO/7043/2011- Rev1) was put for a vote and endorsed by the SCoFCAH.

MS may authorise imports of poultry commodities covered by the Regulation including live poultry, day-old chicks, hatching eggs and poultry meat from the areas not placed under restriction due to the HPAI outbreak confirmed on 8 March 2011.

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		confirmed in poultry (ratites)	located in the districts Oudtshoorn and Uniondale in the Western Cape Province that had previously tested sero-positive in the framework of routine surveillance for avian influenza. South Africa is authorised for imports into the EU of live ratites and of day-old chicks, hatching eggs and meat of ratites. Because of the outbreak, South Africa can no longer certify for these commodities for imports into the EU.
THU 14/04	IΤ	Italy LPAI H7 detected in poultry	Fax 009 to Ms CVO's: information from the Italian authorities on the finding of low pathogenic avian influenza of the H7 subtype on 8 April 2011 during serological surveillance activities in a rural poultry holding located in the commune of Cherasco, province of Cuneo, Piemont region, Italy. Birds present on the holding are culled and cleaning and disinfection will be carried out shortly. A 1-km restricted zone was established around the affected holding in which no other poultry holdings are located.
