


ASF CASES IN WILD BOARS 2019





INSPECTIONS Performed All the non-commercial and commercial holding have been inspected until 15 May 2019 in the entire country including this non-commercial farm

VIOLATIONS

 During the biosecurity check our inspectors found, that disinfection mat was dry and not used.

PENALTY

• The owner of the farm has received administrative penalty due to the non-proper biosecurity measures applied

- ASF started actively spread in that region through the wild boar population since December 2018;
- during first 5 month in 2019 in Šakiai district municipally 32 reports were provided about 63 positive cases in wild boars;
- due to the huge pressure of ASF virus in the environment most probably the first outbreak this year occurred in this area.
- Epidemiological investigation is still ongoing.



- Small non-commercial farm with 6 fattening pigs;
- One of the fattening pigs started feeling sick on 8 of June.
- On 9 June, the owner informed a private veterinarian about two dead pigs.
- Dead pigs organs samples and blood samples of live pigs were taken in the framework of passive surveillance of ASF;
- On 10 June 2019, ASF has been confirmed using RT-PCR from blood and organs.

Measures applied

- Till now all commercial and non-commercial farms (9640 commercial farms with 531080 pigs, 9277 non-commercial farms with 25632 pigs kept) were inspected by official veterinary inspectors;
- Strengthened penalties for the farmers who continuously fails to complain with the biosafety requirements (amended Law on Veterinary Activities);
- Continuous information campaign:
 - -Each farmers receive information leaflets, posters and calendars;
 - -Information via mass media (TV and radio);
 - -For drivers and travelers 100 new signs with information on correct food waste disposal in the rest places .
