

Food safety



- Questions and answers produced and published in all EU languages
- Aimed at reassuring citizens as well as guiding small operators of the food chain
- Complementing national or international recommendations, which are cross-referred to
- Prepared in consultation with Member States and the AGFC

The labelling of food



- Free movement of goods affected
- Impact on supply of raw materials/ ingredients/packaging materials
- Call for temporary contingency exemption on EU food labelling rules
- National measures by Member States
 - National guidelines
 - Case-by-case approaches providing flexibility
- The Commission acknowledged to Member States the need for flexibility on some food labelling provisions, provided that
 - They be induced by the current situation
 - They be thus temporary and justified.
 - They be taken by the competent authorities on a case-by-case basis
 - Food safety is NOT jeopardised
 - Information on allergens be ALWAYS available
- The Commission does not intend to postpone the application of Reg (EU) 2018/775 on origin indication of primary ingredients



Food losses / food waste

- Newsletter of the EU Platform on Food Losses and Food Waste
- First edition (March 2020) dedicated to actions by Platform members (Member States, food business operators or food banks and other NGOs) to prevent food waste during the COVID-19 crisis
- Disseminated to Platform members and their networks, as well as to international partners (e.g. FAO Save Food, WRI Champions 12.3)
- The subscription link is published on the European Commission's Food waste website and DG SANTE's e-news page to reach a wider group of interested stakeholders





Administrative facilitation for data submission for FA, FE and FF



- Online tool CIRCABC Sante-Cad-In developed for business continuity.
- Online data submission / registration for additives, enzymes and flavourings.
 When appropriate, the data is shared with EFSA.
- The system successfully tested with 1 additive and 1 enzyme application already received.

Limit impact on international trade

- EU initiative to use TRACES and recommend acceptance of scanned copies of certificates
 - Letters to Ambassadors of countries exporting to the EU (20 March and 24 March)
- Monitoring of trade impacts
 - Information collected on major trade partners (approx. 50 third countries)
 - Informal exchanges with major food exporters on identified issues





Risk-based adaptation of official controls

- Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/466
