## Background (1)





- 73 million dogs and 84 million cats in the EU
- Market estimated at EUR 1,3 billion
- EU coordinated action on the illegal trade of dogs and cats 2022-2023: widespread forgeries and misleading information
- EFSA report on breeding establishments



## Background (2)





- Growing sale through online platforms
- Many frauds related to third countries
- Incomplete EU traceability rules facilitate frauds
- »Good breeders are disadvantaged
- **»Consumers** are misled and pay the costs
- »Animals suffer



#### Scope



Welfare requirements for establishments =
 breeding establishments, pet shops and shelters



- Identification and registration for any dog or cat offered for sale or at no cost
- Animals used for scientific purposes covered by other legislation



## Obligations for establishments (1)

- Exemptions for small establishments
- General animal welfare principles (five domains)
- Animal caretakers in number and competent
- Breeding strategies not detrimental
- In line breeding first and second degree forbidden



## Obligations for establishments (2) 🏠

- Notification to the authorities for all establishments
- Approval of breeding establishments
- Information on responsible ownership including online
- Detailed competencies for animal caretakers
- Animal welfare visit by a veterinarian



## Obligations for establishments (3)

- Requirements for feeding and watering, housing, health,
   behavioural needs and painful practices
  - <u>Tethering</u> or keeping in <u>containers</u> restricted
  - Keeping <u>only indoor</u> prohibited
  - Minimum <u>age for breeding</u> (and restrictions beyond an age)
  - Mutilations are prohibited (except neutering and medical)



## Competent authorities

Training courses for animal caretakers



- Database for register microchipped dogs and cats
- Databases must be interoperable
- Collecting and reporting data



## Identification and registration (ID)



- Identification by transponders for animals from establishments or supplied by <u>natural persons</u>
- Registration in a <u>national database</u> by a <u>veterinarian</u>
- Any supplier must prove the ID of the animal
- An EU system to check ID to the public free of charge
- Information to online acquirers on the way to check ID



### Entry into the Union



- Compliance or equivalent conditions
- Countries and establishments prelisted
- Certification at import
- Requirements on transponders at import
- Registration in a Member States database in <u>48</u>
   hours



### National rules and timing



- Possibility of stricter national rules
- Application after 2 years
- Delayed application
  - after 3 years for ID and national databases
  - after 5 years for housing, health, interoperability of databases and imports
