Request for information on commercial use of potassium diacetate INS 261(ii) in food

Mixed Competence.

Member States Vote.

The European Union and its Member States (EUMS) would like to provide the following comments:

The use of potassium diacetate (INS 261 (ii)) as a food additive (preservative) was permitted in the European Union (EU) by Regulation (EU) No 25/2013¹.

The use was requested as an alternative to the food additive sodium diacetate (INS 262 (ii)) which is used as a growth inhibitor of microorganisms. The replacement of sodium diacetate by potassium diacetate can contribute to the reduction of dietary sodium intake.

Since the use of potassium diacetate has been requested and authorised quite recently the EUMS are of the opinion that this food additive is in commercial use in the EU.
