

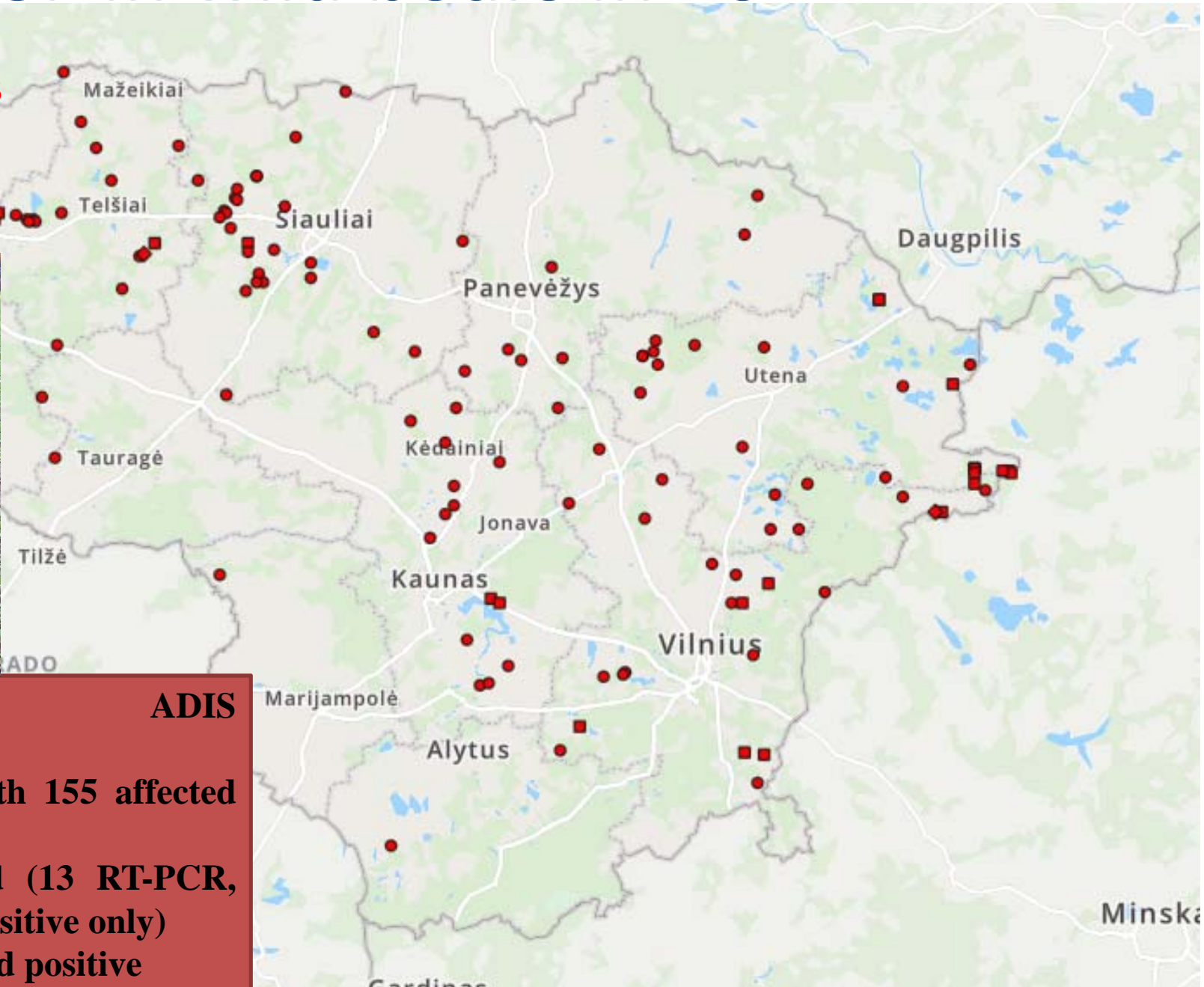

ASF in wild boars in 2021

Within 2 weeks, 28 WB were found dead!



***2021/10/18 ADIS notifications**
128 places with 155 affected wild boars:
- 109 hunted (13 RT-PCR, the rest-AB positive only)
- 46 found dead positive

ASF in domestic pigs in 2021

No ASF outbreaks since 2020/08/10

HOW?

Regular official inspections, biosecurity checks and explanation the importance of biosecurity.

Active work with pig keepers (non-commercial and commercial farms). Regular awareness, training, regular visits despite of Covid-19 situation.

Low number of positive wild boar with active virus (RT-PCR). Limited areas with active ASF virus circulation.

The density of wild boar decreased (more than 3 times).

The main principles of biosecurity in non-commercial farms can prevent from ASF virus.

- Changing boots and clothes before entering pig farm.
- Hands disinfection.
- Disinfection mat before entering pig farm.
- Limited acces for visitors.

Lithuanian territories falling under PART III and revert to PART II

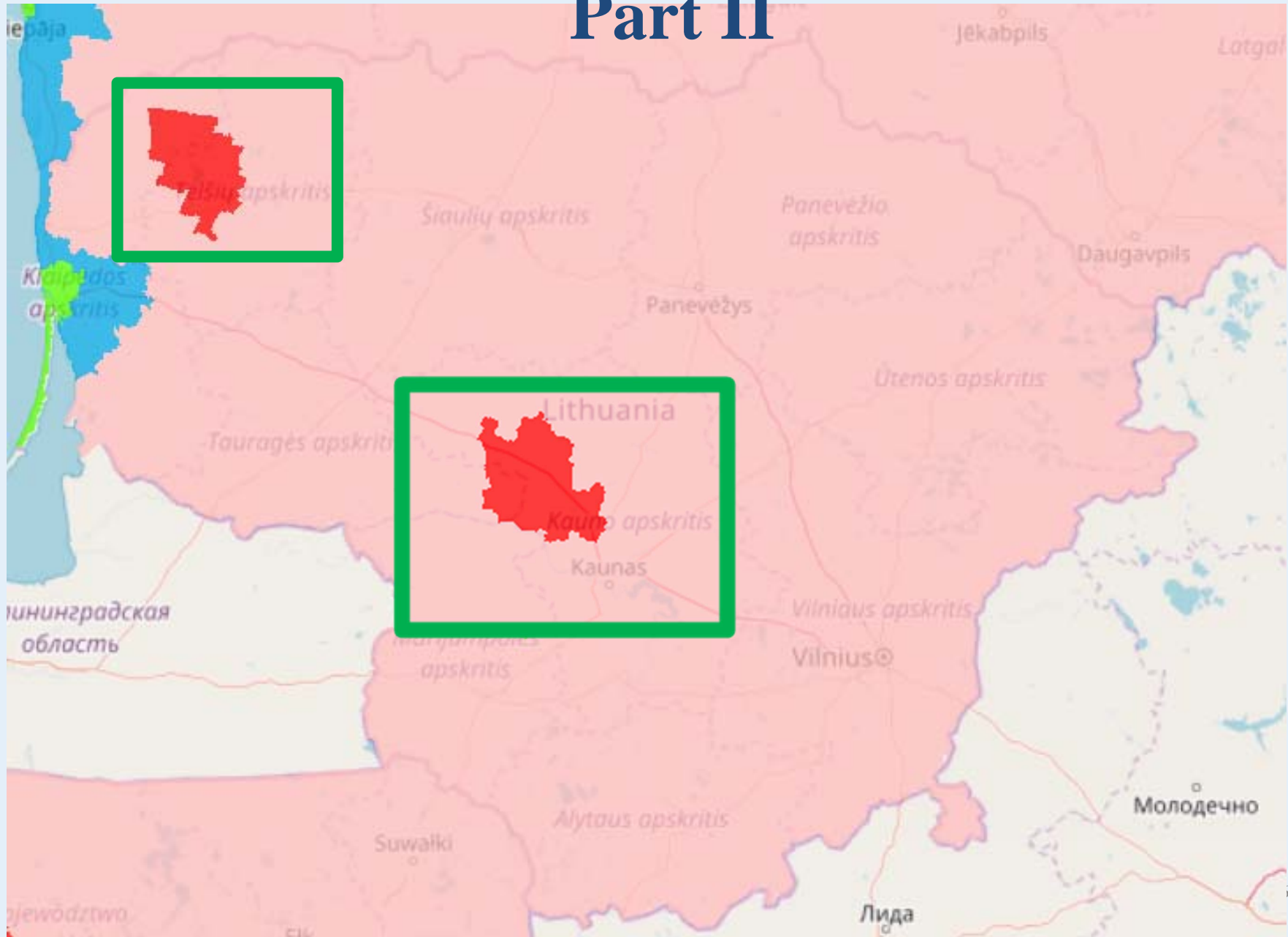
- A. **Jurbarko rajono savivaldybė**: Seredžiaus ir Juodaičių seniūnijos,

- F. **Skuodo rajono savivaldybės**: Barstyčių, Notėnų ir Šačių seniūnijos

According to the working Document SANTE/7112/2015
**Lifting Part III regionalisation and reverting
to Part II are to be based on the following:**

“There have been no ASF outbreak in domestic pigs during the past 12 months.”

- ❖ No outbreaks have been recorded in domestic pig farms since 10 August 2020 ;
- ❖ Official inspections have been performed in the **commercial farms** and inspections have been performed individually in the **non-commercial farms** and it was concluded that the farms complied with the national biosecurity requirements;
- ❖ Information campaign were performed regularly. Additional remote meetings for the farmers/hunters were organized by central/local stated food and veterinary services;

The territory to be reverted from Part III to Part II
