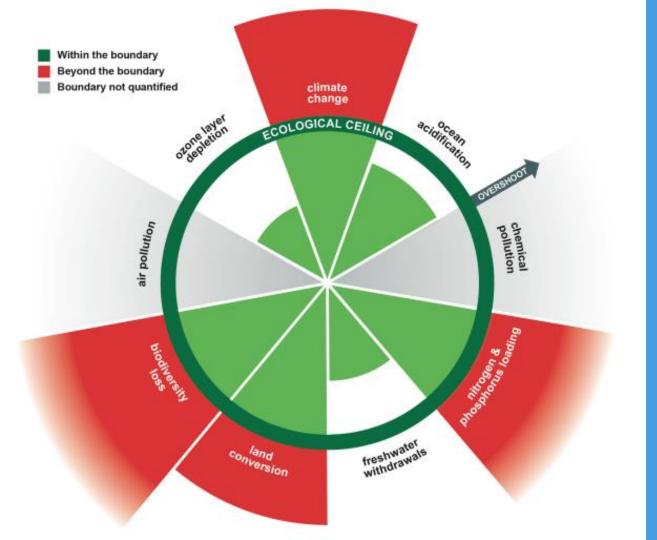

Planetary boundaries are being exceeded

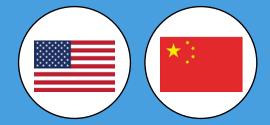

Social – 1 in 9 go hungry



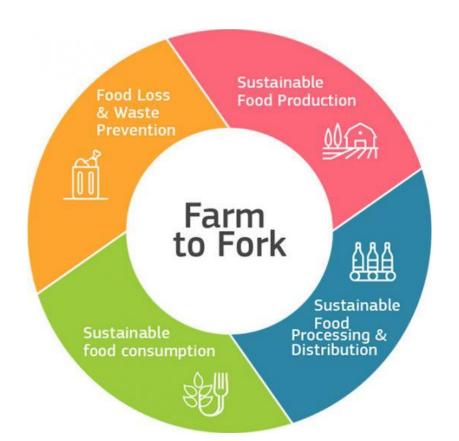


Impact

- Reducing food waste
- Potential 91–102 GtCO₂ (eq)
 (2020-2050) reduced
- Eating plant- rich diets
- Potential 65-92 Gt CO₂ (eq)
 (2020-2050) reduced
- 1st and 3rd most impactful strategies

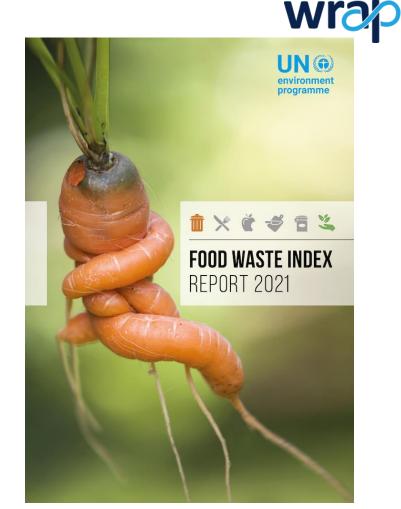
EU & Global Objectives

- 570 Mt in homes
- 240 Mt in food service
- 120 Mt in retail



Household food waste across the world 2019



Income group	Average, kg / capita / year

Progress on the SDG 12.3

- First business to have halved food waste: Ingka Group-the operator of IKEA
- Another 50 major global companies are close to delivering SDG 12.3
- UNEP & WRAP working with 25 countries on measurement and food waste reduction policy
- VERRA- WRAP methodology for converting food waste savings in carbon credits for the voluntary market published this month.





Progress on NDCs

- Analysis up to the end of August by UNEP and WRAP
- 38 countries have included FLW & better food waste management in their NDCs
- Excluded those that have included FLW in supplementary documents



Pledge on FLW to be launched at COP 27

- The pledge is a multistakeholder cooperation and action movement with the goal of reducing FLW and its consequential GHG emissions
- It involves governments, businesses, civil society, and international governmental & NGO's
- Co-ordinating partners of this pledge are WRI, UNEP & FAO.
- Supporters include: Rabobank, WRAP, WWF,
