



HPAI situation in Eurasia and Middle East


- Outbreaks confirmed during summer in Rusia in areas border with Kazakhstan in wild birds and poultry (H5N1 subtype)
- High number of HPAI detections in Georgia over the summer
- Outbreaks confirmed in October in poultry in oblasts closer to Ukraine (H5)
- Outbreak confirmed in Ukraine on 12 October in backyard poultry (H5)
- Outbreak confirmed in poultry in Israel, on 12 October (H5N1)
- H5N1 in backyard poulty in Czechia, confirmed on 30 September (virus with a diferent genotype than the H5N1 viruses detected in EU during spring-summer 2021)
- H5N1 in wild bird in North of Germany, confirmed on 14 October

The HIGH RISK PERIOD has started

Increase attention to biosecurity measures in poultry establishments and related to sector production practices

Legal basis within the AHL framework for the CA to take preventive measures:

1. Article 70 of AHL:

After confirmation of category A disease in wild animals of listed species the CA shall:

- conduct surveillance in wild animal population, and
- take the neccesary prevention and control measures

2. Articles 63-67 of Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/687 (based on Article 70 (3) of AHL)

When category A disease is confirmed in wild animals of listed species, the CA may determine an infected zone based on:

- the disease profile
- -the **risk factors contributing to the spread** of the disease, **in particular**, the **risk of the introduction** of the disease **into establishments** keepin g animals of listed species;

The <u>CA shall immediately inform</u> operators, clinical veterinarians, hunters, other relevant competent authorities and any other natural or legal person concerned about the outbreak of the disease and the control measures adopted.

In the infected zone the CA:

- shall at least implement risk mitigation and reinforced biosecurity measures in order to prevent the spread of the category A disease from the affected animals and infected zone to unaffected animals or to humans;
- may regulate hunting activities and other outdoors activities;

<u>Duration of measures in the infected zone</u>: until the <u>epidemiological information indicates</u> that the relevant <u>wild population no longer poses a risk</u> of introduction of a category A disease into establishments keeping animals of listed species

3. Article 10 of AHL - with responsibilities of the operators to take biosecurity measures regarding wild animals.
