WP 2023-2024

- Purpose: presentation of the timetable for adoption of the 2023 – 2024 work programme related to the EU cofinanced veterinary programmes
- Legal basis:
 - MFF 2021-2027 and Financial Regulation
 - Single Market Programme Regulation (Regulation (EU) 2021/690):

WP 2023-2024

- Single Market Programme Regulation: Article 16 and Annex I.2
- All programmes defined by the SMP regulation shall be implemented by work programmes which shall:
 - define the specific objectives and the eligible actions.
 - set out:
 - the indicative amount allocated to each action (i.e. 107 million EUR for vet programmes);
 - the essential evaluation criteria, and the maximum co-financing rate.
 - the conditions for the actions to qualify for funding
- Work programmes related to the Food Strand (in particular veterinary and phytosanitary programmes) shall be adopted by the Commission by means of implementing acts by 30 April of the year preceding their execution

WP 2023-2024

- WP 2021 – 2022 was adopted only on 6/5/2021 due to the late adoption of the SMP (28/4/2021), with retroactivity provisions (measures eligible from 1/1/2021) and is valid until 31/12/2022
- WP 2023 – 2024 shall be adopted by 30/4/2022 for veterinary and phytosanitary programmes (as MSs shall submit their 2023 programmes by 31/5/2022)

- 6-7/4 PAFF: final approval on WP content followed by a Written procedure
- Adoption by the end of April 2022
