This privacy statement provides information about the processing and the protection of your personal data.

Processing operation: Authorisation procedures and implementation of legislation in the area of food and feed safety

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1. Introduction

The European Commission (hereafter 'the Commission') is committed to protect your personal data and to respect your privacy. The Commission collects and further processes personal data pursuant to Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2018 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data (repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001).

This privacy statement explains the reason for the processing of your personal data, the way we collect, handle and ensure protection of all personal data provided, how that information is used and what rights you have in relation to your personal data. It also specifies the contact details of the responsible Data Controller with whom you may exercise your rights, the Data Protection Officer and the European Data Protection Supervisor.

This privacy statement concerns the processing operation 'Authorisation procedures and implementation of legislation in the area of food and feed safety' undertaken by European Commission, Directorate-General for Health and Food Safety, Directorate E, as presented below.

2. Why and how do we process your personal data?

<u>Purpose of the processing operation</u>: The European Commission collects and uses your personal information only for the following processing activities:

- Processing of personal data necessary for handling applications for the authorisation of products, substances, processes and claims and for monitoring the implementation of authorisations in the area of food and feed safety (under the responsibility of DG SANTE's Directorate E).
- Processing of personal data necessary for carrying out other implementation activities in the area of food and feed safety (under the responsibility of DG SANTE's Directorate E), with the exception of activities covered by separate records (e.g. organisation of meetings of Standing Committees, Working Groups and Expert Groups; organization of other meetings, conferences, workshops or seminars; consultation of stakeholders and the public).

Your personal data will <u>not</u> be used for an automated decision-making including profiling.

This is without prejudice to the possible transmission of personal data to EU bodies or institutions in charge of audit or inspections in accordance with the EU Treaties.

3. On what legal ground(s) do we process your personal data

We process your personal data, because:

- a) processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Union institution or body:
- b) processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation to which the controller is subject.

The basis for the processing referred to in points (a) and (b) of the paragraph 1 has been laid down in the following Union law:

- Regulation (EU) No 609/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 June 2013 on food intended for infants and young children, food for special medical purposes, and total diet replacement for weight control;
- Directive 2009/54/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 18 June 2009 on the exploitation and marketing of natural mineral waters;
- Regulation (EC) No 1331/2008 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 16 December 2008 establishing a common authorisation procedure for food additives, food enzymes and food flavourings;

- Regulation (EC) No 429/2008 of 25 April 2008 on detailed rules for the implementation of Regulation (EC) No 1831/2003 of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards the preparation and the presentation of applications and the assessment and the authorisation of feed additives
- Regulation (EC) No 183/2005 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 January 2005 laying down requirements for feed hygiene
- Directive 2002/32/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 7 May 2002 on undesirable substances in animal feed
- Regulation (EC) No 726/2004 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 31 March 2004 laying down Community procedures for the authorisation and supervision of medicinal products for human and veterinary use and establishing a European Medicines Agency
- Directive 2001/82/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 6 November 2001 on the Community code relating to veterinary medicinal products

4. Which personal data do we collect and further process?

In order to carry out this processing operation the Data Controller may collect Personal data concerning representatives of Member States and national competent authorities, staff working for EU agencies, staff of NGOs, citizens, representatives of professional organisations and applicants and their representatives for the authorisation of products, substances, processes and claims and for monitoring the implementation of authorisations. It may collect the following categories of personal data: gender (Mr/Ms), name, organisation or company, department, position, e-mail address, phone/fax number; ID card/Passport number and date of birth.

5. How long do we keep your personal data?

The Data Controller only keeps your personal data for the time necessary to fulfil the purpose of collection or further processing, namely for 5 years after the authorisation is granted or longer if necessary for monitoring implementation or in line with the requirements of the relevant legal acts.

6. How do we protect and safeguard your personal data?

All personal data in electronic format (e-mails, documents, databases, uploaded batches of data, etc.) are stored either on the servers of the European Commission or of its contractors. All processing operations are carried out pursuant to the Commission Decision (EU, Euratom) 2017/46 of 10 January 2017 on the security of communication and information systems in the European Commission.

The Commission's contractors are bound by a specific contractual clause for any processing operations of your data on behalf of the Commission, and by the confidentiality obligations deriving from the General Data Protection Regulation in the EU Member States ('GDPR' Regulation (EU) 2016/679).

In order to protect your personal data, the Commission has put in place a number of technical and organisational measures. Technical measures include appropriate actions to address online security, risk of data loss, alteration of data or unauthorised access, taking into consideration the risk presented by the processing and the nature of the personal data being processed. Organisational measures include restricting access to the personal data solely to authorised persons with a legitimate need to know for the purposes of this processing operation.

7. Who has access to your personal data and to whom is it disclosed?

Access to your personal data is provided to the Commission staff responsible for carrying out this processing operation and to authorised staff according to the "need to know" principle. Such staff abide by statutory, and when required, additional confidentiality agreements.

The information we collect will not be given to any third party, except to the extent and for the purpose we may be required to do so by law.

8. What are your rights and how can you exercise them?

You have specific rights as a 'data subject' under Chapter III (Articles 14-25) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, in particular the right to access your personal data and to rectify them in case your personal data is inaccurate or incomplete. Under certain conditions, you have the right to erase your personal data, to restrict the processing of your personal data, to object to the processing and the right to data portability.

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data, which is lawfully carried out pursuant to Article 5(1)(a), on grounds relating to your particular situation.

You can exercise your rights by contacting the Data Controller, or in case of conflict the Data Protection Officer. If necessary, you can also address the European Data Protection Supervisor. Their contact information is given under Heading 9 below.

Where you wish to exercise your rights in the context of one or several specific processing operations, please provide their description (i.e. their Record reference(s) as specified under Heading 10 below) in your request.

Any request for access to personal data will be handled within one month. Any other request mentioned above will be addressed within 15 working days.
