

LEGISLATION ON EXTREME BREEDING

BAN ON OFFSPRING

Prohibiting breeding from animals that are likely to produce diseased offspring may prevent future suffering.

BAN ON OWNERSHIP

Such a ban may avoid the pitfalls of lack of traceability of an animal back to his original breeder.

- Lack of **knowledge** of the legislation

- Lack of training
- Lack of definition of limits of conformation
- Seeing extreme feature traits as 'normal for the breed'
- Penalties not robust enough
