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#### **Article 52**

## Details of documentary checks, identity checks + physical checks

For the purposes of ensuring the **uniform implementation** of **Articles 49**, **50** and **51**, the Commission shall, by means of **implementing acts**, lay down detailed rules on the operations to be carried out **during** and **after** the **documentary** checks, **identity** checks and **physical** checks referred to in those Articles to ensure the **efficient performance of those official controls**.

Those implementing acts shall be adopted in accordance with the examination procedure referred to in **Article 145(2)**

documentary check = the examination of the official certificates,
 official attestations and other documents including documents of a
 commercial nature, which are required to accompany the consignment as
 provided for by the rules referred to in Article 1(2), by Article 56(1) or by
 implementing acts adopted in accordance with Articles 77 (3), 126(3),
 128(1) + 129(1)

**identity check** = a **visual inspection** to verify that the content and the labelling of a consignment, including the marks on animals, seals and means of transport, correspond to the information provided in the official certificates, official attestations and other documents accompanying it

physical check = check on animals or goods and, as appropriate, checks
on packaging, the means of transport, labelling and temperature, the
sampling for analysis, testing or diagnosis and any other check necessary to
verify compliance with the rules referred to in Article 1(2)
