European Union Competence European Union Vote

The European Union (EU) reiterates its reservations expressed in CCCF17 concerning certain MLs for lead in spices:

• Spices, dried celery seeds: 1.5 mg/kg

The **EU cannot agree on this ML** as a lower ML (0.9 mg/kg) would be more appropriate based on the As Low as Reasonably Achievable (ALARA) principle and the relevant available data.

• Spices, dried rhizomes, and roots (including galangal): 2.0 mg/kg

The **EU cannot agree on this ML** as, considering the ALARA principle and with a view of protecting consumer health, a lower ML of 1.5 mg/kg would be more appropriate on the basis of available data.

• Spices, dried floral parts: 2.5 mg/kg

The **EU cannot agree on this ML** considering the ALARA approach and that, based on the relevant available data for saffron and capers, an ML of 1.0 mg/kg would be more appropriate. According to EU data the concentration of lead in cloves appears to be below 0.5 mg/kg, so the few samples with concentrations above 2 mg/kg can be considered to be outliers.

• Spices, dried Sichuan pepper and star anise: 3.0 mg/kg

The EU cannot agree on this ML, noting that based on data available in the EU, a lower ML of 0.6 mg/kg for star anise could be established.
