



New items for discussion



Scope, objective and definition:

- Lay down rules for the performance of coordinated intensified controls
- These are performed by the competent authorities at the BCP's in cases of suspected fraudulent or deceptive practices by an operator, or in the case of serious or repeated infringements
- Categories of goods concerned (goods referred to in Article 47(1)
 (b) of OCR Regulation):
 - Products of animal origin
 - Germinal products
 - Animal by-products
 - Composite products and hay and straw (added by Reg. 2019/478)





Coordinated intensified official controls (I):

- MS shall notify COM of decision + indicate origin and infringement
- COM shall assess conditions, and confirm in IMSOC
- If the conditions are met, MS shall perform coordinated official controlson each consignment coming from the same origin, containing the same category of goods and targeting the same type of infringement
- The performance of the controls shall apply until:
 - a favourable outcome is achieved for at least 10 consignments
 - the total weight of controlled consignments reaches at least 10 times the weight of the consignment to which the notification refers
 - NEW: maximum weight rule (300 tons)







Coordinated intensified official controls (II):

- For every infringement revealed, the calculation of consignments in the IMSOC will be reset to zero
- The intensified controls shall be ended when:
 - when the conditions (number and weight) are met, or
 - when a competent authority withdraws its notification.



Imposed Checks:

- Extended intensified official controls which apply when during the performance of intensified controls three consignments reveal the same type of infringement
- The COM notifies the third country about the unfavourable results and requests it to investigate + adopt an action plan + report back
- Imposed checks to end when there is a high level of compliance (sequence of 30 satisfactory results?) + a satisfactory action plan
- COM shall take further action if the third country does not take appropriate action or if the authorities of MS continue to notify unfavourable results





Article 54(3): Establishing Frequency rates for Identity checks and Physical checks

Scope and objective:

- Establish rules for the uniform application of the appropriate frequency rate of identity and physical checks on consignments of animals and goods intended for release for free circulation.
- In general based in current practice. Based on Decision 94/360/EEC and Regulation 1756/2004.
- Shall be carried out in such a way that it is not possible to predict whether any particular consignment will be subject of checks.
- Selection will be carried out by IMSOC. The competent authority may decide to select different consignment instead of consignment selected by IMSOC.
- Frequency rates may be adjusted based on criteria in Article 54(3)(a) of OCR
- Lists of goods and frequencies will be available in IMSOC.
- Enter in force for animals and products of animal origin (Art. 47(a) and (b) of OCR) from 14 December 2019; plants and plant products (Art. 47(c) of OCR) 14 December 2022 19

Health and Food Safety



Article 47(2)b + Article 53 of GFL: Increased official controls and special import conditions on certain feed and food of non-animal origin

Main objectives:

- List the goods (feed and food of non-animal origin) from certain third countries subject to a temporary increase of official controls at BCPs (Annex I)
- Consolidate existing emergency measures establishing special import conditions for feed and food of non-animal origin from certain third countries (Annex II)
- Establish rules on the frequency of identity and physical checks, including laboratory tests, for goods listed in Annexes I and II
- Repealing and replacing Commission Regulations (EC) No 669/2009, (EU) No 884/2014, (EU) No 2015/175, (EU) No 2017/186 and (EU) 2018/1660





Article 47(2)b + Article 53 of GFL: Increased official controls and special import conditions on certain feed and food of non-animal origin

Main changes compared to draft act presented in Advisory Group on 11 October 2018:

- Rules on the frequency of identity and physical checks amended to provide for a **fixed frequency**, laid down in the Annexes, and subject to regular review (every six months) by the Commission
- Application to compound products limited to certain compound food in relation to risk of contamination by aflatoxins for which CN Codes are indicated in Annex II
