What is a risk assessment?

- We conduct every day: crossing a road, consumption of certain type of food;
- Importing food
- Importing alive animals





Risk assessment

- Structured
- Transparent
- Qualitative or quantitative





The OIE framework for risk assessment





 Hazard identification: pathways for hazard to be released in a particular environment (back yard, commercial farms etc.);

• **Entry** (release assessment): probability that the process will occur;

• **Exposure assessment**: possible consequences for animals exposed to the hazard;
