With some 47 million tonnes of cereals processed each year, the European flour millers are the largest single food users of domestic wheat, rye and oats. The sectors employs over 45 000 people – mostly in Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (SMEs) - and an estimated 350 000 indirect labour at European farm level.


Actions

EUROPEAN MILLERS' CONGRESS 2024: We organise a conference with sessions to address millers entitled "Preparing for a sustainable future" and "Delivering on sustainability, grain sourcing and energy" on various subjects linked to sustainability in the context of our European Congress that took place on 6-8 June 2024 in Munich, including:

- Secure the access to milling wheat in the context of the Green Deal Farm-to-Fork Strategy and the food regulatory framework (European Commission, DG SANTE)
- Sustainability and market trends in the European bread market: challenges, opportunities and perspectives (Ditsch)
- **Corporate Sustainability Compliant** implementation and communication (AFC Risk & Crisis)
- **Creating Value through Insights: the economic** sustainability case for flour millers (Bühler)

Explore the possibility of developing sector-specific tools and resources in support of this Code

- **GREEN CLAIMS:** at the level of the association Board, discussions are ongoing and external parties are approached to address the current possibilities to enhance **environmental footprint for wheat flour** to substantiate green claims.
- CARBON FARMING: European flour millers welcomed the establishment of an EU regulatory framework for the
 certification of carbon removals as an essential steppingstone towards achieving a net contribution from carbon
 removals, in line with the EU climate-neutrality objective for 2050. Millers should be allowed to claim removals
 generated within their supply chain (wheat, rye and oats) as a priority, while certificates should be made available to
 the entire value chain but not beyond it.

Continue to engage in dialogue with other food chain/systems actors and EU and international policymakers to forge (new) relationships, exchange good practices and discuss challenges encountered, learn from each other (studies, projects) and create better mutual understanding, and identify opportunities for collaboration and potential partnership

- PRIMARY FOOD PROCESSORS CSRD: European Flour Millers are also engaging in dialogue with other vegetal first-processing sectors to address regulatory aspects related to the new Corporate and Sustainability Reporting Directive (CSRD). In January 2024, Primary Food Processors (PFP) held a workshop to raise awareness on new sustainability obligations of its members companies.
- **BREAD VALUE CHAIN**: At the level of the <u>Bread-Initiative</u> Platform gathering all the actors of the bread value chain, European Flour Millers contributed to engage in dialogue on the impact of the farm-to-fork strategy regulatory context with an emphasis on health and nutrition relating to bread.
