








Herd Incidence: downwards trend




Decline from 5.88% in 2008 to 3.51% in 2018 2017: 3.47%

Herd Prevalence




The number of reactors per year has decreased significantly





- Decrease from c.30,000 in 2008 to 17,491 in 2018
- testing
- 2018: 6.9m cattle; 8.8m tuberculin tests; 50,000 gamma interferon tests

• Increase of 225 on 2017 figure, attributed to increased gamma interferon

TB test reactor density has decreased







Wildlife Programme

- Badgers: cattle TB can prompt a removal programme locally if epi link
- Policy of badger vaccination now in place since 2018
- Badger removal will still take place if necessary, where severe cattle outbreaks occur and the evidence implicates badgers
- Wildlife control is critical to stop spillover into cattle population



Things are changing

- Stakeholders TB Forum has secured general agreement from stakeholders on new TB policies
- Agreement to continue with 6-monthly Forum meetings
- Opportunity to renew the TB eradication programme, improve effectiveness and drive disease down for the 2030 target

TB Forum

- Government decision May 2018
- 3 consultation papers
- 7 meetings of Forum
- 5 bilateral meetings with farm bodies
- Final agreement at June 25th 2019 meeting

TB Forum recommendations: Governance

- Regular 6-monthly meetings 1.
- 2. Public meetings in areas with higher levels of bTB
- 3. Each regional office to host an annual bTB meeting with local farming representatives



TB Forum recommendations:

Disease policies (in addition to existing programme)

- 4. Enhanced biosecurity advice
- 5. Single DAFM point of contact within regional offices for liaising with farmers in bTB breakdowns
- 6. Action plans for areas with higher levels of bTB
- 7. Additional resources into addressing disease transmission from wildlife (incl. deer and further research in the area)

TB Forum recommendations:

Disease policies

- 8. Enhanced support to approx. 300-500 herds at higher risk of recurrence
- 9. Simplified Herd Risk Categorisation e.g. Old: FDO New: C4
- 10. Increase actions to reduce the risk from animals which test inconclusive

I. Effectiveness of On Farm Market Valuation Scheme

II. Cost Benefit Analysis of TB Programme to inform financing

- Minister to launch renewed TB **Eradication Strategy**
- **Develop Action Plan**
- TB Stakeholder Forum to reconvene in Q4 2019
- **Commission reports**
- Monitor and evaluate effectiveness, revise policy accordingly

Challenges

- Research shows risk is greater in dairy and large herds
- Rapid expansion of dairy industry in Ireland
- Increasing bovine density less herds, more cattle
- Stakeholder buy-in
