



Don't be the carrier of a deadly pig disease




African swine fever (ASF) is a **highly contagious** disease of domestic and wild pigs. It is not a danger to human health but it is devastating for farming economy. There is no vaccine against it.

Travelling within or outside a country? By car, bus, train, airplaine, boat?

Do not spread the disease.

YOU MUST TAKE PRECAUTIONS







Do not visit farms unless it is necessary



If you are in regular contact with domestic pigs, do not hunt wild pigs









African swine fever (ASF) is not a danger to human health but kills domestic and wild pigs. There is no vaccine against it.

The virus is highly resistant in the environment and in contaminated pork products.

Carelessness can spread the disease.

Key biosecurity principles

to protect your and your neighbours' farms





SEGREGATION

Create and maintain physical barriers to limit opportunities for disease spread by humans, animals or materials. When properly applied, segregation will prevent contamination and infection.




Secure the farm entrances. Maintain robust perimeter barriers and properly store food/water to prevent wild boar contact



Strictly control staff and visitor movement on and off farm



Control the entry of pigs by implementing quarantine measures

COMMISSION REGULATION (EC) No 206/2009

of 5 March 2009

on the introduction into the Community of personal consignments of products of animal origin and amending Regulation (EC) No 136/2004

(Text with EEA relevance)

Article 7

Reporting obligations

- 1. Member States shall submit to the Commission, every year, a report summarising the relevant information on the measures taken to advertise and enforce the rules laid down in this Regulation, and on the results thereof.
- 2. The report shall be in the form of a completed table as set out in Annex V, and shall be submitted by the **first day of May** in the year immediately following the end of each annual reporting period. The reporting period shall run from 1 January to 31 December.
