


North Africa and Middle East – recent events




Figure 1: Recent FMD global outbreaks (new headline events reported October to December 2021 are highlighted) with endemic pools highlighted in orange. Source: WRLFMD. Map conforms to the United Nations World Map, June 2020.

Conclusions

- FMDv circulation and risk of new incursions in the EU neighbourhood remains high
- The huge **small ruminant population** and connected animal movements is a challenge
- Increased number of outbreaks are reported in connection with **seasonality** (e.g. spring)
- The **restrictions** connected to COVID-19 have affected control and surveillance activities in some countries
- **Resources** were also re-directed in some cases to address other priorities
- Reduced availability of vaccines is reported to implement national vaccination programmes or to respond to outbreaks
- There are **effective control plans** implemented in some countries providing evidence of progressive reduction of FMDy circulation

The focus should remain on:

In endemic countries

- promote **risk based** surveillance and control to optimize resources and improve effectiveness of c. measures
- facilitate the risk information sharing (movements, risk maps, vaccination, surveillance, PVM)
- monitor effectiveness of measures implemented
- Continue support the **global surveillance** to monitor circulation strains

In free countries

- Risk monitoring and preparedness to be maintained at adequate level



EuFMD Capacity development programme

- EuFMD offers a **training catalogue** of virtual and in-presence training programmes for improving preparedness for management of FMD and similar transboundary animal by EuFMD Member Nations and across Europe as a whole;
- Main training programmes available for European audience:
 - Real Time training: an in-presence training provided in FMD endemic countries which provides participants with the unique opportunity to visit FMD suspected premises and carry out clinical and epidemiological investigations in "Real Time"; EuFMD is currently piloting an hybrid version in FMD-free countries due to current COVID-19 travel restrictions;
 - FMD Emergency Preparation: virtual course open to up to 120 participants, suitable for veterinarians who will be directly involved in diagnosis or investigating FMD suspicions or outbreaks;
 - Other training offerings include:
 - In-presence workshops: Wildlife surveillance, Depopulation, disposal and cleaning and disinfection;
 - Virtual trainings: FAST disease Crisis management, Organizing Simulation Exercises;
 - Support to national simulation exercises;
 - Ad hoc initiatives.
