




Movements within the EU

Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/688 provides for the movements of live animals within the EU.

The rules allow for certain derogations whereby the Member State of destination accepts animals in compliance with certain animal health conditions. To make these derogations operational, the Member State of destination must inform the Commission and the other Member States that the movements in compliance with certain animal health conditions are authorised.

Ongoing internal discussions

- **Strategy for 2025 (in function of the disease)**
 - Vaccination policy (compulsory/voluntary, information about efficiency of available vaccines, financial issues)?
 - Strengthened surveillance (vectors surveillance, targeted surveillance)?
 - Same movement management and zoning approach?
- **Longer-term strategy (in function of the disease)**
 - Adaptation of the categorization?
 - Risk based surveillance and early detection?
 - Better and faster availability of vaccines?
 - Eradication policy?



Ongoing internal discussions 2

Other vector-borne diseases (West Nile Fever, Crimean Congo Hemorrhagic Fever, Rift Valley Fever,...)

- Zoonotic risk => One Health approach ?
- WOAH standards and EU regulation
- Strengthen surveillance
