






Different epidemiological situations inside the Member States

Movements within the EU

Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/688 provides for the movements of live animals within the EU.

The rules allow for certain derogations whereby the Member State of destination accepts animals in compliance with certain animal health conditions. To make these derogations operational, the Member State of destination must inform the Commission and the other Member States that the movements in compliance with certain animal health conditions are authorised.

The Commission has received the following information concerning the derogations:

12 Member States adopted derogations

- > Maintaining trading opportunities
- Increasingly complicated procedures

- Vaccination policy (compulsory/voluntary, information about efficiency of available vaccines, financial issues)?
- Strengthened surveillance (vectors surveillance, targeted surveillance)?
- Same movement management and zoning approach?
- Longer-term strategy (in function of the disease)
 - Adaptation of the categorization?
 - Risk based surveillance and early detection?
 - Better and faster availability of vaccines?
 - Eradication policy?
